COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the District Board of the Gardiner Road District have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along a road hereinafter mentioned being common to their own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the portion of road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to common-toll roads, viz.:—

The portion of the road known as "The Dandenong Road," passing through the Gardiner road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the City of Melbourne and the said Gardiner Road District.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO MERCHANTS, AGENTS, AND MASTERS OF VESSELS TRADING TO WELSHPOOL, CORNER INLET.

REFERRING to the intimation dated 12th June, 1863, respecting Welshpool Jetty, it is hereby directed:—

1. Merchants, agents, and others will be required to give, at the Custom House, Port Albert, twenty-four hours' clear notice prior to their landing goods at, or shipping goods from, the jetty in question.

2. An officer will then be despatched thither at the expense of the applicant to attend to such landing or shipping, as the case may be; and such officer will be empowered to receive the inward report of masters of vessels trading to Welshpool, and to clear vessels outwards without the necessity of any master proceeding to Port Albert.

3. Any goods landed or shipped, except under the provisions of the laws relating to the Customs, and in presence of an officer of Customs, will be forfeited, and the parties concerned in the illegal landing or shipment thereof will be liable to the penalties imposed by the said laws.

The notice issued on the 12th June, 1863, is hereby cancelled.
