TOLLS APPLICABLE TO ROADS WITHIN SHIRES AND ROAD DISTRICTS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of April, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the board of every district, by special order confirmed by the Governor in Council, from time to time to direct that tolls shall be payable and collected at any toll-house, toll-gate, or toll-bar within the district, or any bridge or ferry within the district, or placed under the control of the board, for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through, by, on, or over the same respectively, and by the same or any other special order to be confirmed in like manner, to appoint the several tolls so payable, and in like manner from time to time to alter or abolish the same or any tolls in force at the commencement hereof, but so that such tolls shall in no case exceed the several amounts or vary from the rates and proportions of toll to be from time to time limited and prescribed by the Governor in Council; and every such special order, when confirmed, shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall, at the expiration of one month from the day of such publication, take effect and be of the same force and validity as if the several matters thereby directed had been directed by this Act: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if satisfied that any road, bridge, or ferry at which such tolls are payable is in a ruinous state or incapable of being worked, to direct that such tolls shall cease to be payable until the same has been effectually repaired or put in working order, and such tolls shall cease to be payable accordingly:

And it is also enacted, that all tolls heretofore lawfully directed by the central or any district road board, or the Board of Land and Works, or the trustees of any road, to be paid at any toll-house, toll-gate, toll-bar, bridge, or ferry, and in force at the commencement of this Act, shall be and continue payable thereat respectively under this Act until altered or abolished under the provisions hereof:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, limit and prescribe the rates and proportions of toll hereinafter set forth, in accordance with the hereinbefore recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

NOTE.—Each driver of an empty cart, dray, or other such vehicle, passing through the toll-gate for the purpose of obtaining manure shall, on payment of the full rate of toll, be entitled to receive a ticket stating the date and amount of toll paid, which amount (less one penny) shall be refunded to the driver of such cart, dray, or other vehicle, when returning on the same day laden with manure.

Tolls payable one way only for going and returning on the same day.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall within thirty days after the commencement hereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked before the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Eastern province and the police magistrate acting in the locality hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint Morse's Creek an additional polling place for the Buckland division of the said province: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Morse's Creek to be an additional place in and for the Buckland division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the Eastern province.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the Boroughs of Ballarat and Buninyong, and the District Board of the Dandenong Road District, have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:-

The road known as the Raglan road, the road known as the Plough Inn road, and the road known as the Creswick road, within the boundaries of the borough of Ballarat and of the shire of Ballarat, shall respectively be Common-toll roads of the borough of Ballarat and the shire of Ballarat aforesaid.

The Dandenong road, within the boundaries of the Dandenong road district and the Oakleigh and Mulgrave road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the road districts aforesaid.

The portion of the Geelong and Ballarat road intersecting the shire of Buninyong and the borough of Buninyong shall be a Common-toll road of the shire and borough last aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
