BLACKWOOD GOLD ESCORT.

BLACKWOOD GOLD ESCORT.

THE Blackwood Police Gold Escort will be re-established on the following conditions, and will run fortnightly until further notice, commencing on Tuesday, the 24th of May, and reaching Kyneton in time for the mid-day train:—
Gold will be received on alternate Mondays, commencing the 23rd proximo, at Blackwood, for escort, but only for delivery to known residents at Kyneton, or to bank agents on route by the mid-day train, whose appearance must be previously guaranteed by the banks, and who must be provided with orders from the managers of their respective banks to receive parcels of treasure from the police at Kyneton.

The police will take delivery of such parcels of treasure, scaled, at Blackwood, and take receipts for the same number with unbroken seals, at Kyneton; but no responsibility whatever will be incurred by the police as to their value or contents.

Should doubt arise as to the person presenting himself to receive the treasure being duly authorised to receive it, or should no person appear at all, the treasure, if any, will be stored at the Police Barracks, Kyneton, until removed by the bank; no responsibility being incurred, no charge will be exacted for its custody.

Managers of Banks or other persons desirous of availing them-

ponsibility being incurred, no charge will be exacted for its custody.

Managers of Banks or other persons desirous of availing themselves of this escort will therefore be good enough to notify, in writing, before the 15th proxino, to the officer of police in charge at Kyneton, whether they will appoint agents to take delivery on the foregoing terms, of parcels of treasure from the police scort officer, on the stoppage of the mid-day train at the Kyneton railway station.

Should no such notification be received from either residents at Kyneton or bankers there or elsewhere, the escort will not start.

PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such

district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation therefor as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district. And whereas the area of the district hereinfafter named, and the amount of the last general rate therein, are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly. Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darlins, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Colao Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of certain Boroughs and the Dis-WHEREAS the Councils of certain Boroughs and the District Boards of certain Road Districts have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads bereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of The Local Government Lot, 1863: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:—

The road extending from Dryburgh street to the Saltwater River shall be a Common-toll road of the borough of Hotham, the borough of Footscray, and the Braybrook road district.

The road known as the Macaulay road shall be a Common-toll road of the borough of Hotham and the borough of Essendon and Flemington.

The portion of the Mount Alexander road passing through the borough of Hotham and the borough of Essendon and Fle-mington shall be a Common-toll road of the said two boroughs.

The road passing through the borough of Richmond, crossing the River Yarra, and through the borough of Prahran, shall be a Common-toll road of the said boroughs of Richmond and Prahran.

The portion of the road known as the Upper Plenty road, extending from the northern end of Brunswick street, Fitz Roy, to the northern boundary of the Upper Plenty or Morang road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the said Upper Plenty or Morang road district and of the Epping road district.

The main Dandenong road through the Gardiner road district shall be a Common-toll road of the said Gardiner road district and of the Oakleigh and Mulgrave road district.

The main Dandenong road through the Gardiner road district shall be a Common-toll road of the said Gardiner road district and of the city of Melbourne.

APPORTIONMENT OF THE TOLLS OF A COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

TOILL ROAD.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 255th clause of The Local Government Act, 1863, has, by an Order in Council made on the 3nd day of May, 1864, determined that the revenue derived between the 2nd day of September, 1863, and the 31-12 day of March, 1864, from tolls payable and collected upon the portion of from the meeting of the Dandenong Road District to the River Bunyip (proclaimed as a Common-Tolleroad by Proclamation dated the 30th of November, 1863), be handed over to the Dandenong District Road Board; and that the revenue derived from the same source on and after the 185-day of April, 1864, shall be distributed amongst the several district road boards interested therein in the following proportions, viz.—

To the Berwick District Road Board, one-third.
To the Cranbourne District Road Board, one-third.
