TOLLS LIMITED AND PRESCRIBED FOR SHIRES AND ROAD DISTRICTS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the ninth day of May, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the board of every district, by special order confirmed by the Governor in Council, from time to time to direct that tolls shall be payable and collected at any toll-house, toll-gate, or toll-bar within the district, or any bridge or ferry within the district, or placed under the control of the board, for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through, by, on, or over the same respectively, and by the same or any other special order to be confirmed in like manner, to appoint the several tolls so payable, and in like manner from time to time to alter or abolish the same or any tolls in force at the commencement hereof, but so that such tolls shall in no case exceed the several amounts or vary from the rates and proportions of toll to be from time to time limited and prescribed by the Governor in Council; and every such special order, when confirmed, shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall, at the expiration of one month from the day of such publication, take effect and be of the same force and validity as if the several matters thereby directed had been directed by this Act: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if satisfied that any road, bridge, or ferry at which such tolls are payable is in a ruinous state or incapable of being worked, to direct that such tolls shall cease to be payable until the same has been effectually repaired or put in working order, and such tolls shall cease to be payable accordingly:

And it is also enacted, that all tolls heretofore lawfully directed by the central or any district road board, or the Board of Land and Works, or the trustees of any road, to be paid at any toll-house, toll-gate, toll-bar, bridge, or ferry, and in force at the commencement of this Act, shall be and continue payable thereat respectively under this Act until altered or abolished under the provisions hereof:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of April last certain rates and proportions of toll were limited and prescribed: And whereas it is expedient to alter the same:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, and doth hereby prescribe the rates and proportions of toll hereinafter

set forth as the limit of tolls which the board of every district is empowered by the said Act to direct to be payable and collected, but so that such tolls shall in no case exceed the several amounts or vary from the rates and proportions of toll hereby limited and prescribed, that is to say:—

BLACKWOOD GOLD ESCORT.

THE Blackwood Police Gold Escort will be re-established on the following conditions, and will run fortnightly until further notice, commencing on Tuesday, the 24th of May, and reaching Kyneton in time for the mid-day train:—

Gold will be received on alternate Mondays, commencing the 23rd proximo, at Blackwood, for escort, but only for delivery to known residents at Kyneton, or to bank agents on route by the mid-day train, whose appearance must be previously guaranteed by the banks, and who must be provided with orders from the managers of their respective banks to receive parcels of treasure from the police at Kyneton.

The police will take delivery of such parcels of treasure, sealed, at Blackwood, and take receipts for the same number with unbroken seals, at Kyneton; but no responsibility whatever will be incurred by the police as to their value or contents.

Should doubt arise as to the person presenting himself to receive the treasure being duly authorised to receive it, or should no person appear at all, the treasure, if any, will be stored at the Police Barracks, Kyneton, until removed by the bank; no responsibility being incurred, no charge will be exacted for its custody.

Managers of Banks or other persons desirous of availing themselves of this escort will therefore be good enough to notify, in writing, before the 15th proximo, to the officer of police in charge at Kyneton, whether they will appoint agents to take delivery on the foregoing terms, of parcels of treasure from the police escort officer, on the stoppage of the mid-day train at the Kyneton railway station.

Should no such notification be received from either residents at Kyneton or bankers there or elsewhere, the escort will not start.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrates acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of _____" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF MANSFIELD, comprising the Mansfield Town Common (described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) and the Farmers' Common, described as situate at Ford's Creek, near Mansfield, in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of March, 1861. And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned commons.—(64.J.3411.)

BYE-LAW.—SUPPLEMENTARY TO BYE-LAW No. 3, REGULATING ALLUVIAL WORKING IN THE RAGLAN DIVISION OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT, 10TH APRIL, 1861.—[4th May, 1864.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the fourth day of May. One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *General protection to prospectors.*—Prospectors shall be entitled to mark out and hold the extent of ground hereinafter provided for, and shall be protected against any other party for the same lead within the distances specified in the following tables, viz.:—

Hill surfacing ...	100 yards in every direction.
Hill sinking ...	300 yards in every direction.
Dry frontage leads ...	500 yards above and below on the supposed course of the lead.
Wet frontage leads ...	1000 yards above and below on the supposed course of the lead.

Any party discovering a lead within the above-mentioned distance during the time the authorized prospectors are in search for it shall only be entitled to an ordinary claim.

2. *Prospecting.—Size of claims.*—Prospectors discovering a new lead shall be entitled to an extent of claim as specified in the following table, viz.:—

Hill surfacing. One prospector only.	Hill sinking. Limited to four men.	Dry workings in flats and gullies. Limited to four men.	Wet workings. Limited to eighteen men.
50 x 50 feet.	1 man 60 x 60 feet. 2 men 90 x 90 feet. 3 men 120 x 90 feet. 4 men 120 x 120 feet.	100 feet along the course of the lead with full width thereof for each man.	For each man double the ordi- nary extent of ground along the course of the lead, with full width thereof, specified in clause 13 of Bye- law No. 3, 10th April, 1861, re- gulating alluvial working in the Raglan division of the Ararat Mining District.

3. *Repeal clause.*—Clauses 21 and 22 of Bye-law No. 3, 10th April, 1861, regulating alluvial working in the Raglan division of the Ararat mining district, are, from and after this date, hereby repealed.

DUNOLLY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Dunolly Public Cemeteries.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives, for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. No catacomb or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.
