APPLICATIONS FOR REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD FIELDS IN VICTORIA.

PERSONS deeming themselves entitled to rewards for the discovery of Gold Fields in the colony of Victoria are requested to make application to the undersigned on or before the 22nd January, 1864, and to furnish the following information:—

1. A description of the locality in which the discovery was made, sufficient to indicate its position and distinguish it from other Gold Fields, together with the approximate distances of the prospector's claim from the nearest gold working at the time of discovery, and from the nearest town.
2. The nature of the workings, depth and character of sinking, &c.
3. The time at which the discovery was made, giving the exact date if possible.
4. The names in full of the discoverers.
5. The name of the Government Officer (if any) to whom the discovery was reported, and the time at which such report (if any) was made.

Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important. Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

Claims for rewards for discoveries made in 1863 cannot be entertained, a previous board having been appointed for their consideration; neither will discoveries be considered for which any reward has been paid by the colony.

THE TYLDEN AND TRENTHAM ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of July, 1859, the boundaries of the Tylden and Trentham road district were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition to the said district by the extension of its south-western boundary: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Tylden and Trentham road district by the extension of its south-western boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of the Coliban and Little Coliban Rivers; thence by the Little Coliban River to the north-western angle of portion 1, in the parish of Tylden; thence east to the Campaspe River; thence southerly by the said river to the south-western angle of portion 111, in the parish of Woodend; thence east to the south-eastern angle of portion 110 in the said parish; thence due south to the Great Dividing Range forming the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence westerly by the said county boundary to the western source of the Coliban River; and thence by the said river to the commencing point.—(63.2137.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED ENLARGEMENT OF THE SWAN HILL ROAD DISTRICT.

APPLICATION has been made by the Swan Hill District Road Board requesting that the district may be extended "according to the following boundaries:—Commencing from the north-east angle of the Mount Jellicott Road District; thence westerly along the north boundary of the said district to Lake Tyrrell; thence in a straight line to the intersection of the 142nd degree of longitude with the 35th parallel of latitude; thence along the said parallel of latitude west to the Adelaide boundary; thence along the said boundary north to the south bank of the River Murray; thence along the south bank of the river easterly to the boundary of the Swan Hill Road District; thence along the said boundary southerly to the commencing point."

The Chairman of the Board states that the estimated rates of the present Swan Hill Road District at 1s. 6d. in the pound do not amount to £1000, and that the inhabitants are desirous "to have the district annexed as above described," so that that amount may be reached in order to enable them to apply for the proclamation of the district to be a shire.

The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

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


