Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important.

Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

By His Excellency Sin Charles Hinny Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Meibourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupen become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of July, 1839, the boundaries of the Tylden and Trentham road district were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition to the said district by the extension of its south-western boundary: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Tylden and Trentham road district, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Tylden and Trentham road district by the extension of its south-western boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that it to say:—
