THE TALBOT GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Vic-
toria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the
reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make
provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of
General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other
things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from
time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the times
at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter
or vary as the said Governor shall think fit: Now there-
fore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria,
with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint
a time for holding a Court of General Sessions of the Peace at
the undermentioned place in manner following, that is to say:—

At Talbot, in and for the district of Talbot, on Monday, the
sixth day of June now next ensuing.

Melbourne, this seventeenth day of May, in the
year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her
Majesty's reign.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE
HEATHCOTE AND THE STRATHFIELDSAYE
ROAD DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is
amongst other things enacted, that for adjusting the
boundaries of shires and districts to those of electoral districts,
it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if it shall seem
fit, but so far only as may be necessary for such adjustment, to
do without petition all or any of certain acts therein mentioned,
and amongst other acts to take away from any shire or district
any portion thereof, and to add to any adjoining shire or district,
or some one or more riding or subdivisions thereof, the portion
so taken away: And whereas by a Proclamation under the
hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date
the fifteenth day of June, 1863, the boundaries of the Heath-
cote road district were defined as therein mentioned: And
whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth
day of August, 1863, the boundaries of the Strathfieldsaye road
district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it
seems fit to adjust the boundaries of the said road districts so
that they shall coincide in part with those of electoral districts:
Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of
Victoria, do hereby declare and proclaim that for the purpose
of adjusting the boundaries of the said road districts so that
they shall coincide in part with the boundaries of electoral dis-
tricts, I have, by and with the advice of the Executive Council,
added two portions of land to the said Heathcote road district,
and severed a portion from the said Strathfieldsaye road dis-
trict; and in order more clearly to show the boundaries of the
said respective road districts as now altered, I do hereby re-
define the same in manner following, that is to say:—

—THE HEATHCOTE ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point
on the River Campaspe due west of Mount Camel; thence due
east to the River Goulburn; thence southerly by the said river
to the Stony Creek; thence southerly by the Stony Creek to
the northern boundary of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive right;
thence west by the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive
right and a direct line to a point two miles west of the northern
boundary of the said pre-emptive right; thence by a line due
south to the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by the centre of Sugar
Loaf Creek southerly to its junction with Mollison's Creek;
thence by the centre of Mollison's Creek south-westerly through
the township of Pyalong to its junction with Spring Gully,
shown on the county map of Dalhousie as having its source at
"Permanent Springs," thence in a line directly south to meet
the northern boundary of the county of Bourke or southern
boundary of the electoral district of Dalhousie; thence westerly
by the said electoral boundary to a point due east of the
northern boundary of the parish of Carlruhe; thence by a
direct line west to and by the northern boundary of the parish
of Carlruhe to the centre of Piper's Creek; thence northerly
by the centre of Piper's Creek to its junction with the Cam-
paspe River; thence by the centre of the said River Campaspe
northerly to the commencing point; excepting the borough of
Heathcote.—(64.613.)

THE STRATHFIELDSAYE ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at
the north-east corner of the Sandhurst municipality; thence
east four hundred and ninety chains to the west boundary of the
parish of Axedale; thence north one hundred and six chains to
the north-west angle of allotment 10, section XI, of the said
parish; thence east by the north boundary of the said parish to
the centre of the Campaspe River; thence south by the Cam-
paspe River to the Coliban River; thence south-westerly by the

Coliban River to the Myrtle Creek; thence westerly by the
Myrtle Creek to the south-west angle of the parish of Lyell;
thence north to the south-east angle of the parish of Sedgwick;
thence west by the southern boundary of the said parish to the
south-east angle of the parish of Mandurang; thence by the
southern boundary of the said parish to the northern boundary
of the parish of Harcourt; thence west by the northern boundary
of the said parish of Harcourt and a direct line to the eastern
boundary of the railway from Melbourne to Sandhurst; thence
northerly by the said eastern boundary of the railway to the
southern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence
easterly by the southern boundary of the said municipality to
the southern boundary of the Golden Gully annexation to the
said municipality; thence easterly and northerly by the south-
ern and eastern boundary of the Golden Gully annexation to the
eastern boundary of the Quarry Hill annexation to the said
municipality; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the
Quarry Hill annexation to the commencing point.—(63.788.)

SIR,—I have to inform you that Her Majesty's Government
have decided to station a Consul in the territory of Sarawak,
now governed under the authority of James Brooke, and that
the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer that appoint-
ment upon Mr. G. T. Ricketts. The special attention of Mr.
Ricketts has been drawn to the importance of extending British
trade in that portion of Borneo, and he has been desired to
furnish the governors of Her Majesty's possessions in the east
and elsewhere, and especially the Government of India, with
any information which may be useful to the interests of those
possessions. I have accordingly, in announcing the appoint-
ment of Mr. Ricketts, to instruct you to afford him such sup-
port as it may at any time be in your power to give him in
furtherance of that object.
