## CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH REWARDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR THE DISCOVERY OF NEW GOLD FIELDS DURING THE YEAR 1864.

VOTE OF £10,000.—REWARDS TO DISCOVERERS OF GOLD FIELDS IN 1864.

THAT person will be deemed the discoverer who shall first find gold, mark out a claim, and notify the same in writing to the warden or police magistrate of the district. In such notification the discoverer shall state, as nearly as practicable, the exact locality, and the distance from the nearest gold workings or nearest town.

2. No reward will exceed £1000. In fixing the amount to be paid for any discovery, regard will be had to the number of men employed on the new gold field, its distance from the nearest gold workings, the character of the deposits in which the gold occurs, and the depth of sinking.

3. If two or more persons simultaneously discover gold in the same locality, or in places immediately adjacent, and they each severally comply with the conditions above mentioned, the sum proper to be awarded will be divided amongst the several persons who have discovered the gold field, in such manner as shall be just.

4. Rewards shall be given in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

- For the discovery of a gold field distant more than one mile and less than two miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £200.
- For the discovery of a gold field distant more than two miles and less than three miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £300.
- For the discovery of a gold field distant more than three miles and less than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £400.
- For the discovery of a gold field distant more than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, six months after the report of the discovery, not less than 500 men, a sum not exceeding £1000.

The words "nearest gold workings," shall mean gold workings on which miners are actually employed in searching for gold.

## ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACE FOR THE TARRAWINGEE DIVISION OF THE MURRAY DISTRICT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of May, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Murray electoral district and the police magistrate acting in the locality hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint Oxley an additional polling place for the Tarrawingee division of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Oxley to be an additional polling place in and for the Tarrawingee division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the electoral district of the Murray.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## NOTICE RESPECTING THE CLOTHING ISSUED FOR THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.

THE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be made of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The Blankets are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3¼ inches in width.

Serge Shirts: Brownish-grey and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red and white stripes.
