## ARTESIAN WELLS.

A SUM of Two thousand pounds (£2000) is hereby offered by the Government as a reward (subject to the under-mentioned conditions) to the first successful discoverer of an Artesian stream of water within that portion of the basin of the River Murray lying below the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray, and being within the colony of Victoria.

1. That such Artesian stream be at a distance of not less than ten miles from any portion of the River Murray, and at a distance of not less than five miles from any tributary thereof, or from any fresh-water lake, or any other permanent supply of fresh water.

2. That the water of such Artesian stream be fresh and suitable for drinking and other domestic purposes.

3. That it rise so as to flow over, at, or above the surface of the ground, without the aid of any mechanical appliances whatsoever, and that it continue so to flow and to remain fresh at the expiration of six months from the date of its first rising to the surface.

The due fulfilment of the above conditions will be referred to the decision of a board to be appointed for the purpose by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

**SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF MAJORCA.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DABLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Township of Majorca shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

**NOTICE RESPECTING THE CLOTHING ISSUED FOR**  
**THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.**

**T**HE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be made of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The *Blankets* are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3½ inches in width.

*Serge Shirts:* Brownish-grey and yellow check.

*Cotton Shirts:* Narrow red and white stripes.

At a meeting of the council of the city of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall, Swanston street, in the said city, on the 3rd, and by adjournment on the 4th and 5th days of May, 1864, at which were present—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman John Thomas Smith, presiding; Aldermen Richard Eades, Richard Evans Hill, John Harbison, and Michael Keeley; Councillors William Hayes, Henry Donovan Brown, Joshua Corwell, Edward Cohen, John Edwards, John George Goldsmith, William Grant, Michael Gallagher, George Hughes, Charles Edwin Jones, Isaac Lyons, Joseph Story, Samuel Thorpy, James Weedow, and George Wragge, being more than one-third of the members of the said council—it was resolved and ordered, That whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intitled, *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property, within the city of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted, that

where any street, court, or alley on private property, in the city of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been, sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively:

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 178, intitled, *An Act to further alter and amend the laws relating to the city of Melbourne and of the town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and accessible from and communicating with, such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use or do commonly use the same: And that the word "owner" used in the said Act shall apply to and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of such street, court, or alley, under the authority hereof, monies of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession, accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expense incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne in the formation, drainage, and repair of every such street, court, or alley on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to the order annexed marked A have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it, now ordered by the council of this the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A shall, within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, and marked B. And it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, or alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, or alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order; and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate part of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners, so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition in which the pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, draining, and sewerage of such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

Made and passed by the council of the city of Melbourne, at the meeting of the said council held on the 5th day of May, 1864, by adjournment from the 3rd and 4th days of the same month.

LA TROBE WARD.

1. Tivoli place, situate on the west side of Hoddle street, commencing at a point 567 links south of Domain road.

3. Private street on the west side of Park street, commencing at a point 1150 links from the north side of Gardiner's Creek road.

#### SCHEDULE B,

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides) is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½-inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private entrances lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining street shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require. No. 915

### BYE-LAWS OF THE SPRINGFIELD ROAD DISTRICT.

#### STANDING ORDERS.

#### ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

THAT the ordinary meeting of the board shall be held on the first Monday of each month at the hour of Two o'clock p.m., at the office of the board, Springfield; the business to commence as soon as a quorum shall be present; and should there be no quorum present at the end of one hour after the said time appointed for said meeting, the names of the members then present shall be entered in the minute book, and the meeting shall be adjourned for three days according to the provisions of the 133 section of *The Local Government Act*.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the board the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

3. At all meetings of the road board the reading of the correspondence, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and the bringing up of reports of committee, shall have precedence of all other business.

4. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice shall have been given in the usual manner, and the only questions that shall be entertained shall be that the petition be ordered to lie on the table, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board. Any member of the board may bring forward such business as he may think fit in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing, signed with the name of the member giving it, to the clerk of the road board, three clear days previous to the meeting at which it shall be intended such business shall be taken into consideration. All such business to be considered according to priority of notice.

6. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who shall have given such notice, or some one authorised by him, in writing, shall be present when the business shall be called in order. Notices of motions not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

7. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have first been proposed, nor until the next ordinary meeting of the board; and every such bye-law shall in the meantime remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers at the office of the board.

#### ORDER OF DEBATE.

1. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment, or of discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman presiding; and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, and the member so calling another member to order shall be heard upon the point of order only; and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject previously under discussion shall be resumed or any other subject entered upon; and the decision of the presiding chairman on any point of order shall be final.

2. Any member making a motion or an amendment shall put it in form, sign, and deliver it to the clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without leave of the board.

3. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply calling the attention of the chairman to the fact that such order has been disobeyed.

4. If two or more members rise together to speak, the chairman shall decide which shall be entitled to speak first.

5. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, and no member shall impute improper motives to any other member, and all personal reflection upon any member shall be considered as disorderly, and the member making use of such expressions and refusing to withdraw or explain the same, and to offer an apology for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular word used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

7. The presiding chairman shall, in taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion from the show of hands as to whether any motion or amendment be carried or negatived.

8. The board shall vote by show of hands. Any member of the board may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall first stand up and remain standing until their votes shall have been recorded, and afterwards those voting in the negative.

9. No member shall speak more than once on any motion or amendment, except in reply or personal explanation.

10. Every motion and amendment shall be entered in the minute book, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division the votes shall be recorded therein.

11. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

#### GENERAL RULES.

1. The clerk shall attend at the office of the board, Springfield, on Mondays and Thursdays, from the hours of One o'clock p.m. to Three o'clock p.m., to receive notices and transact the ordinary business of the board.

2. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall be made until after eight clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement.

3. Contracts shall be by tender, and shall be advertised as the board may direct.

4. All tenders and applications for offices shall be opened by the acting chairman in the presence of the board.

5. The security to be required from contractors shall be in all cases ten per cent. upon the amount of the contract, to be paid by the contractor to the treasurer of the board, which amount shall be repaid to the contractor when he obtains his final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily performed.

6. In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due according to the assessment roll. In no case shall the collector institute any legal proceedings for the recovery of rates without being instructed by the board.

7. The collector shall pay over to the treasurer weekly all moneys collected by him. He shall also furnish an account of all such moneys.

8. The collector and treasurer shall present their accounts at every ordinary meeting of the board.
