INSTRUCTIONS TO BE OBSERVED DURING THE HOSTILITIES BETWEEN DENMARK AND THE GERMAN POWERS.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch of the Secretary of State to be published for general information.

SIR,—The following Instructions have been drawn up by Her Majesty's Government for the guidance of Her Majesty's Civil and Naval Authorities Abroad, during the continuance of the present hostilities between Denmark and the German Powers, and it will be your duty to take care that these instructions are strictly observed within the colony under your government.

1. During the continuance of the present hostilities between His Majesty the King of Denmark, on the one side, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, His Majesty the King of Prussia, and the Germanic Confederation, or any of these powers, on the other side, no prize captured or taken by any armed ship of any of the belligerent powers, or by any officers or persons in the service of any of the said powers, shall be permitted to be brought into any of the ports, harbors, roadstead, or waters belonging to Her Majesty, either in the United Kingdom or elsewhere.

2. All ships of war of any of the said belligerents are strictly prohibited from making use of any port or roadstead in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions abroad, as a station or place of resort for any warlike purpose, or for any purpose of warlike equipment; and no ship of war of any of the said belligerents shall hereafter be permitted to sail out of, or to leave any port, roadstead, or waters subject to British jurisdiction, from which any vessel of the power or powers with whom such belligerent is at war (whether the same shall be a ship of war or a merchant ship) shall have previously departed, until after the expiration of at least twenty-four hours from the departure of such last-mentioned vessel beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty.

3. These orders are to be in force, and to be strictly observed in every case, until Her Majesty shall be pleased to make any further or other order to the contrary.

4. The word "Privateer" is not used in these instructions, because by the Declaration respecting Maritime Law, signed at Paris on the 16th April, 1856, Austria and Prussia agreed that "Privateering is and remains abolished," and Denmark adhered to the same Declaration, on the 25th of June, 1856.

ARTESIAN WELLS.

A SUM of Two thousand pounds (£2000) is hereby offered by the Government as a reward (subject to the under-mentioned conditions) to the first successful discoverer of an Artesian stream of water within that portion of the basin of the River Murray lying below the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray, and being within the colony of Victoria.

1. That such Artesian stream be at a distance of not less than ten miles from any portion of the River Murray, and at a distance of not less than five miles from any tributary thereof, or from any fresh-water lake, or any other permanent supply of fresh water.

2. That the water of such Artesian stream be fresh and suitable for drinking and other domestic purposes.

3. That it rise so as to flow over, at, or above the surface of the ground, without the aid of any mechanical appliances whatsoever, and that it continue so to flow and to remain fresh at the expiration of six months from the date of its first rising to the surface.

The due fulfilment of the above conditions will be referred to the decision of a board to be appointed for the purpose by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute*, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough such license shall expire at the end of the then current year, provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation; And whereas the Council of the Borough of Eaglehawk has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole Borough of Eaglehawk to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE RESPECTING THE CLOTHING ISSUED FOR THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.

THE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be made of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The Blankets are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3½ inches in width.

Serge Shirts: Brownish-grey and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red and white stripes.
