REGULATION AS TO CROWN GRANTS OF LANDS SELECTED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined Regulation, under *The Land Act, 1862*, § 133, relative to the issue of Crown Grants of leased moieties of allotments to original selectors and lessees or their heirs and assigns, viz. :—

Crown Grants of the leased moieties of allotments under *The Land Act, 1862*, shall not be made out and issued until the full amount of rent has been paid, and the persons entitled to such grants have made written application for the same to the Commissioner of Lands and Survey.

Persons claiming as the heirs of the original selectors and lessees must, in addition to the above application, give proof of heirship and of the death of the person through whom they claim; or if claiming as assignees, proof of the fact of their being the assignees of the original selector and lessee.

NEW MANUFACTURES AND INDUSTRIES.

THE Governor in Council having appointed

to be a Board to consider claims for Rewards and Premiums for New Manufactures and Industries, in accordance with the regulations submitted to Parliament on the 1st June, 1864, all persons who may deem themselves entitled to rewards or premiums under the regulations referred to, are requested to forward their claims to Mr. Chaloner Greville, secretary to the Board, Custom House, Melbourne.

A copy of the Regulations is attached, to the 4th clause of which the Board desire to direct particular attention.

REGULATIONS FOR EXPENDING THE SUM OF FIVE THOUSAND POUNDS, VOTED BY PARLIAMENT IN THE YEAR 1864, FOR THE PROMOTION OF NEW MANUFACTURES AND INDUSTRIES.

1. The Governor in Council shall appoint a Board, to whom shall be referred the consideration of all claims for premiums or rewards under the above grant.

2. Such sums as may be recommended by the said Board shall (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) be paid to the persons or company who shall first successfully establish in Victoria any new manufacture or production.

3. Precedence of claim will be given to the following items, and the reward measured by the excellence and extent of the manufacture or article produced:—

Woollen Goods.—Blankets, rugs, flannels, cloth, or other woollen fabrics of general use.

Paper.—Wrapping, printing, or writing.

Glass.—Sheet or plate glass, tumblers, wine glasses, or bottles.

Crockery.—China, porcelain, or any of the finer classes of earthenware.

Leather.—For excellence in the manufacture of leather, for other and higher purposes than the sole and kip leather now produced.

Olive Oil.—The produce of trees grown in Victoria (the quantity not being less than 100 gallons).

Flax.—Not less than one ton, properly prepared for manufacturing purposes.

Flax (or Linseed) Oil.—Not less than 100 gallons, properly prepared for manufacturing purposes.

Hemp.—Not less than one ton, properly prepared for manufacturing purposes.

Cotton.—Not less than one ton, properly prepared for manufacturing purposes.

Hops.—Not less than one ton, properly prepared.

Silk.—Not less than one hundredweight, the produce of silkworms bred in Victoria.

4. It shall be competent for the Board to receive, and, if approved of, to recommend rewards for other articles of local manufacture or production, or to offer and publish such special rewards or premiums as it may think fit; and also to refuse rewards or premium to any new article of growth or manufacture, if it is not considered to be of merit and usefulness sufficient to entitle it to favorable consideration.

PRIZE ESSAYS.*

IT is hereby notified that, in pursuance of a resolution of the Legislative Assembly, a premium of One hundred and fifty pounds will be awarded for the best essay on each of the two following subjects, viz.:-

I.

Pleuro-pneumonia; its causes, symptoms, post-mortem appearances (pathology); the best means of treatment; and practical hints on the avoidance of the disease and its eradication from the colony.

II.

Scab; its causes, symptoms, pathology; best means of treatment; and practical hints for its avoidance and extermination.

The possibility of determining by inspection of the entire or divided animal in slaughter-houses or butchers' shops whether the animal has died or been slaughtered; whether it has been the subject of the above or any other disease; and if so, what are the signs by which such disease can be recognized.

Whether food prepared from such flesh should be allowed to be consumed, or whether it should be confiscated and destroyed.

The essays must be legibly written on foolscap paper, on one side only, and leaving a two-inch margin.

No essay is to be in the handwriting of its author nor signed with his name; but for the purpose of identification each essay must bear a motto, and must be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the name and address of the author, and on the outside, but not in the author's handwriting, the motto affixed to the essay.

The essays must be forwarded to this office, addressed to the Honorable the Chief Secretary, on or before the 1st February next.

The Government will appoint three judges to decide on the respective values of the essays, but it reserves to itself the power to withhold the premium in the case of either subject, should the essays be considered unworthy of the premium offered. The essays for which premiums may be awarded will be considered the property of the Government.

BYE-LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE RAILWAY COMPANY.

THE Melbourne Railway Company, pursuant to and by virtue and in exercise of all and every the powers, authorities and privileges given to or conferred on them by an Act of Legislature of the Colony of Victoria (numbered 134) passed in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to enable the Melbourne and Suburban Railway Company to sell their undertaking and property and for other purposes*, and also of all other powers and authorities enabling the said company in this behalf, do hereby make, pass, enact, and establish the Bye-laws, Rules, and Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. The accounts of the company shall be made up to the last day of March and the last day of September in each year, by the accountant; and be audited by the auditors appointed by the company, and a just and true statement or balance-sheet of the moneys received and expended during the previous six months, shall be certified by the auditors under their respective hands.

2. The common seal of the company shall be kept in the chief office of the company, in the city of Melbourne, in a box having two locks of different kinds thereon; and the secretary shall be responsible for the safe custody and care of the box containing such common seal; and that the key of one of such locks shall be kept by the secretary, and the key of the other of such locks by the chairman or one of the directors.

3. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or document without the authority of the board of directors; and every deed or document so sealed shall be countersigned by one of the directors and the secretary, or in the case of the absence of the secretary, by the chairman and by one other of the directors of the company.

4. Every vote or resolution passed at any meeting of the board of directors, or any general meeting of the company, requiring for its legal efficacy the affixing the common seal to any deed or document, shall be deemed a sufficient authority for affixing the common seal thereto.

5. Melbourne station time is to be observed at all stations.

6. No passenger, unless having a free pass, will be allowed to take his or her seat in or upon any carriage used on the railway, or to travel therein upon the railway, without having first paid his or her fare and obtained a ticket.

7. No male passenger will be allowed to enter or remain in any waiting-room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females; and any person persisting in remaining in any such room or carriage after being warned to leave the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and may be forthwith taken into custody by any servant of the company or by any one whom such servant may call to his assistance.

8. Tickets are not transferable. A ticket can only be used by the person for whom it may be issued. Any person using or attempting to use a transferred ticket, will subject himself or herself to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Passengers will only be booked conditionally, that is to say in case there shall be room in the train for which they are booked. The holders of periodical tickets shall have priority over holders of return and single tickets, and the fare will be returned, on application to the station master, to the holders of such return and single tickets as shall be unable to obtain seats. No compensation will be allowed to periodical ticket holders, unless the line of railway is closed to the public for a period of twenty-four hours; in such case a proportionate rebate will be made.

10. Each passenger, on paying his or her fare, will be furnished with a ticket which he or she is to show whenever required by the station master or porter authorised by him, or by the guard in charge of the train, and if it be a journey or return ticket he or she must allow it to be marked when required; and every ticket (whether single, return, or periodical) must be delivered up on demand of any porter, guard, or other servant of the company who may be authorised to collect tickets, it being distinctly understood that tickets furnished to passengers on pay-

ment of their fares remain the property of the company, and are not sold to passengers. Any of the company's tickets that may be out of date may at any time be claimed by the company.

11. Any passenger refusing to produce his or her ticket on leaving any carriage, will be required to pay the fare according to the class in which they travelled from the place whence the train originally started.

12. No passenger shall be entitled to re-book or take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station.

13. No ticket will be recognised by the collectors or servants of the company authorised to collect or examine tickets, unless the number, date, and names of the stations printed on such ticket are perfectly legible.

14. The holder of any such ticket, which may be defaced or rendered illegible in the above particulars, will be regarded as not having paid his or her fare, and will be dealt with accordingly.

15. Every person attempting to defraud the company by travelling upon the railway without having previously paid his or her fare and obtained a proper ticket, or by riding in or upon a carriage of a superior class to that for which he or she has taken out a ticket, or by altering a return or periodical ticket, or endeavouring to use it after or beyond the time or distance for which it was originally granted, or by attempting in any other manner to evade the payment of his or her fare, shall pay to the company the sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered, shall think fit to order to be paid.

16. Any person, not being an officer or servant of the company, opening any carriage for the purpose of entering or leaving the same by using a private key or other instrument, or jumping in or out of any carriage window, after the tickets have been examined, and the carriage doors locked by the station master, guard, or other person appointed for that purpose, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered, shall think fit to order to be paid.

17. No person will be allowed to ride outside a carriage or vehicle on the railway under any circumstances whatever, or get into, or upon, or to quit any carriage when the train is put in motion; and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid, and be expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket of what kind soever such ticket may be.

18. Dogs will be conveyed and charged for, but they will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages.

19. Any person making use of insulting or abusive language to any officer or servant of the company while in the execution of his duty, or any person making use of obscene or blasphemous language in any carriage, or upon any platform, or premises of the said company, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

20. If any person not being in the employment of the company, or without written authority, shall walk, ride, travel, or trespass upon the railway line, or on any land within the railway fences, or shall cross the line, except at the authorised crossing-places, at which gates or bridges are provided, or at a station, such person shall forfeit a sum or penalty of not exceeding Five pounds, and may be at once arrested by any servant of the company, or by any one whom he may call to his assistance.

21. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the carriages and in and upon the company's premises, and every person smoking in a carriage other than that provided for the purpose, or upon the said premises, after being warned to desist, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid; and, in addition to such penalty, be immediately, or if travelling, at the first opportunity, expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket of what kind soever such ticket may be.

22. Any person found in a carriage or station, or upon the company's premises, in a state of intoxication, or committing any nuisance, or wilfully interfering with the comfort of the passengers, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid; and shall immediately, or if travelling, at the first opportunity, be expelled from the company's premises, and forfeit his fare and ticket of what kind soever such ticket may be.

23. Any passenger cutting the linings, removing or defacing the number plates, breaking the windows, or otherwise wilfully damaging or injuring any carriage on the railway, shall pay to the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid, in addition to the amount of damage done.

24. No gratuity is under any circumstances allowed to be received by the company's servants, on pain of immediate dismissal.

25. No drayman, porter, carter, or other person, will be allowed to come into or upon the company's premises for the purpose of removing luggage, either with or without a dray or hand-cart or truck (unless required by a passenger, and specially engaged by such passenger for the express purpose); and no person will be allowed to come into or upon the company's premises for the purpose of touting or soliciting custom (unless licensed to do so by the company) or hire of whatsoever kind; any drayman, carter, porter, or other person, evading or attempting to

to evade this regulation, or refusing or neglecting to quit the company's premises when thereto required by the station master or other servant of the company, shall be expelled from the company's premises, and in addition thereto shall pay the company a sum or penalty of Five pounds, or such other less sum or part of such penalty as the justice or justices before whom such penalty may be sought to be recovered shall think fit to order to be paid.

The directors of the company may from time to time issue and give such regulations and directions for the observance, conduct, and guidance of the officers and servants in the employ of the company, in the performance and discharge of their respective duties, as the board of directors shall approve of.
