POSTAGE STAMPS. NOTICE.

AFTER the 2nd August next no postage stamps can be supplied for the use or on the requisition of any person in the public service under the Government of Victoria (see 27 Victoria No. 226, clause 18).

After the abovenamed date no letter or packet from or to any of the Government Departments will be exempt from postage, unless it be "On Her Majesty's Service," and be so described on the outside thereof, and have impressed thereon a "Frank stamp" not obliterated or defaced (27 Victoria 226, clause 14).

Officers of the Civil Service and others who may require frank-stamped envelopes, must apply for the same in the usual manner to the ministers controlling their respective departments, and must keep an account of the way in which such envelopes as they may be supplied with are used.

All postage stamps (issued on requisition) that may be unexpended after the 2nd proximo, must be sent to this office with as little delay as possible, in order that the persons against whom they are charged may be duly credited with the value of the stamps returned by them.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute*, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Amherst has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling,

the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole borough of Amherst to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

POLLING PLACES FOR ELECTIONS IN CERTAIN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of July, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that in and for each original district within thirty days after the commencement of this Act, and in and for each single proclaimed district within fifteen days after the constitution thereof, the Governor in Council shall, and from time to time afterwards if it shall seem fit may on the application of the board of any such district, appoint a sufficient number of polling places for every such district at which the poll shall be taken at all elections held for the same, and may from time to time on the like application alter and vary the same: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the thirtieth day of September, 1863, polling places were appointed for elections in original districts: And whereas by divers Orders subsequently made the polling places were varied and altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to appoint polling places for the Echuca Road district, and to alter and vary the polling places in certain original districts and shires: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The polling places in the first schedule hereunto annexed shall be the polling places for elections for the Echuca Road District.

The polling places in the second schedule shall be additional polling places for the districts opposite to which respectively such additional polling places are mentioned.

The polling places in the third schedule shall be substituted polling places for the shires or road districts opposite to which respectively such substituted polling places are mentioned, viz.:—

ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrates acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Homebush shall be an additional place in and for the Avoca division of the electoral district of Avoca for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the said district of Avoca.

Stuart Mill shall be an additional place in and for the Navarre division of the electoral district of Crowlands for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the said district of Crowlands.

Block 5, section I, parish of Newham, shall be an additional place in and for the Campaspe division of the electoral district of Dalhousie for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the said district of Dalhousie.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES OF THE 2ND CASTLEMAINE VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

1. That an entrance fee of Two shillings and sixpence be charged for all candidates for admission to any company of the corps, the same to be paid before the person applying is sworn in.

2. That each member shall pay a subscription of Three shillings per quarter, payable in advance, during the months of April, July, October, and January; any member neglecting to pay his subscription to be fined Sixpence for the first month, and One shilling for every succeeding month he is in arrear.

3. The senior officer present at any meeting of a company shall take the chair.

4. The officer commanding each company may at any time convene a special meeting of his company, and shall do so on receiving a requisition in writing signed by ten enrolled members of the company.

5. A special meeting of a company shall not be held to have been duly convened unless notice thereof shall have been given at parade or company drill, and an advertisement shall have been inserted or a circular issued to every member three days previously, stating the business for which the meeting is called. The usual notice to be posted on the board at the orderly room.

6. Business shall not be transacted at any meeting of a company unless sixteen members be present; and if sixteen members be not present within a quarter of an hour of the time fixed for the meeting it shall lapse.

7. That notice of any person wishing to join a company, together with his address and occupation, shall be given on two parades of the company or posted for one week in the orderly room or other appointed place. Any member objecting to the candidate shall communicate the same to the commanding officer privately, who shall decide on the validity of such objection. If, after such decision, either party desire it, a ballot shall be taken, when one black ball in four shall exclude.

8. Any member appearing at parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in charge the sum of One shilling.

9. Any member changing his permanent address shall give notice thereof in writing to the officer commanding his company within fourteen days; failing to do so, he shall be fined Two shillings and sixpence.

10. Notice of all fines imposed under the regulations in these rules shall be given to the members at two separate parades in the following month, or shall be posted in the orderly room, or some other place appointed for the purpose, on the first day of the same, and must be paid during that month.

11. Any member who may be fined shall be informed thereof at the earliest convenient opportunity.

12. An account of all fines shall be kept in a book open to inspection in the orderly room.

13. An account shall be kept with each member of a company, in which he shall be debited with all sums charged to his company on his behalf for uniform and drill instruction, and credited with all amounts earned by him as an effective.

14. If on the 1st of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by Ten shillings, he shall be fined the amount of such difference: Provided always, that the amount of such fine shall in no case exceed Two pounds, and that the commanding officer of his company may remit such fine or defer the enforcement of it. Any payment made under this rule shall be carried to the member's credit.

15. Any member desiring to quit his company, under the provisions of the Act, shall be fined the amount, if any, by which his debit exceeds his credit: Provided that such fine shall not exceed Two pounds, and that the whole or the half of such fine may be remitted at the discretion of the commanding officer.

MAIN ROAD UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

The mortality of the month under review was 20 below the average of the month of June in the last five years. The deaths in it numbered 240, against 310 in May and 278 in April.

Deaths of males amounted to 64 per cent. of the total mortality; deaths of females to 36 per cent. The latter proportion was much below the average. Deaths of children who had not attained their fifth year were, for the first time since last December, exceeded by those of persons who had passed that age, and were in the proportion of only 45 per cent. to the mortality. The same circumstance has, however, usually occurred in the corresponding months of previous years. In June, 1863, the proportion was but 31 per cent.; in June, 1862, it was 43 per cent.; in June, 1861, it was 51 per cent.; and in June, 1860, it was 49 per cent.

Fourteen deaths took place on the 11th; this was the highest number on any one day. Only 2 deaths were recorded on the 8th.

The death of a male stated to be 99 years old was recorded during the month; also that of another male aged 81, and of one aged 75. The cause of death in all these cases was referred to old age.

The violent deaths which took place during the month numbered 21, and occurred as follows:—Two adult males were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a gunner in the Royal Artillery in the Sandridge lagoon; a stoker of a steamboat was found floating in the Saltwater River; and a child of 2 years old was accidentally drowned at Williamstown. A ship carpenter, aged 40, died of dislocation of the vertebrae of the neck; a male, aged 24, died of fractured ribs; a farmer, aged 56, and a laborer, aged 19, of compound fractures of the leg; a master mariner, aged 40, and a laborer, aged 55, of fractures of the skull. A miller, aged 23, was returned as having been crushed to death. A contractor, aged 32, was murdered by a pistol shot. A boy of 9 died of internal injuries inflicted in a manner not reported. Four infants were suffocated in bed, and one infant died of suffocation shortly after birth, how occasioned not stated. A child, aged 2 years, died of burns, and one, aged 8 weeks, died from the effects of an overdose of morphia.

Fifty-one deaths, or about 21 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital 33, Benevolent Asylum 5, Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum 9, Immigrants' Home 2, Military Barracks 1, Western Gaol 1.
