NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as hereinafter provided for, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.

11. The extent of the areas of leases shall be (except in special cases hereinafter provided for):—

1. For ordinary leases an area not less than one acre nor more than thirty acres.
2. For quartz leases an area the length of which shall not exceed six hundred yards, nor be less than one hundred yards along the line of the lode, and the width thereof shall not be more than two hundred yards nor less than fifty yards measured across the lode;

and they are hereby required to mark out such lands as near as may be in the form therein prescribed.

Much delay and no little inconvenience have occurred in consequence of lessees marking out areas in such a manner as to include lands which by law cannot be demised for mining purposes.

NOTICE TO AGENTS, MASTERS OF VESSELS, AND SEAMEN.

WITH reference to the "Notice" in the *Government Gazette*, dated 25th March, 1859, the following conditions under which "permits" will be granted to seamen to engage with masters of vessels in the absence of certificates of discharge, are published for general information, viz.:—

1. No seaman shall be engaged in the *coasting* trade without a certificate of discharge.
2. In the *foreign* trade, if a master engages a man without a certificate of discharge, a "permit" may be granted on payment of a fee of Five shillings.
3. In cases where it can be clearly shown by the books of the office that a man has lost his certificate of discharge, the shipping master may issue a "permit" on payment of a fee of Five shillings.
4. No seaman shall be engaged by an officer of the Shipping Office without production of a "permit" or certificate of discharge.

Seamen are cautioned that they become liable to a penalty of six months imprisonment, or a fine of £50, for the fraudulent use of certificates of discharge, and that the provisions of the law in that respect will be strictly enforced.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter or vary as the said Governor shall think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint a time for holding a Court of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned place in manner following, that is to say:-

At Talbot, in and for the district of Talbot, on Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of September now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAW.—[15th August, 1864.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the Offices of the Board, Old Treasury, Queen street, in the city of Melbourne, on the 15th day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:-

34. All societies entitled to the grant in aid of Agricultural Societies for the year 1864 shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or, in other words, each pound of revenue above £500 in each case shall rate as Ten shillings.

METROPOLITAN CORPS ROYAL VICTORIA VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY.

RULES.

1. Every person desirous of becoming a member of the corps shall make application, in writing, addressed to the officer commanding, and containing the following particulars:-

Name in full.
Age.
Height.
Occupation.
Private address.
Business ditto.

2. No person shall be eligible as a member of the corps unless he shall be five feet seven inches in height: Provided always that the officer commanding the volunteer force shall have power to suspend this rule in such case or cases as he may deem advisable.

3. The names of all applicants for admission shall be posted up at the place of drill at least 14 clear days prior to being admitted a member of the corps, and no person shall be so admitted unless approved of by the officer commanding.

4. Any member changing his private or business address must within 14 days of such change give notice thereof, in writing, to the drill instructor, or such other person as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose by the officer commanding, or, failing such notice, shall pay a fine of Two (2) shillings and six (6) pence.

5. All fines must be paid to such person as the officer commanding may appoint, within 14 days after notice in writing has been given that any fine is due.

6. When six (6) days' notice by an advertisement signed by or for the officer commanding, published three (3) times in the newspaper in which the advertisements of the corps are usually published, has been given of an inspection of arms or accoutrements, members failing to bring or send their arms or accoutrements to such place and at such time as may be appointed by the said advertisement, or within seven (7) days thereafter take the same to the inspecting officer, shall pay a fine of Two (2) shillings and six (6) pence.

7. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein every member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf for drill instruction, uniform, and accoutrements, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective; the said account to be audited at least once in every year by the auditors appointed by the corps.

8. If on the 1st day of January in any year a member's debit shall exceed his credit, he shall be fined the amount of such difference. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed to the credit of the member paying the same.

9. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps, under the provisions of the Act No. 183, section 5, he shall pay the amount whereby his debit exceeds his credit.

10. The officer commanding shall have power to remit the whole or any portion of the fines referred to in any of the preceding rules at his discretion.

11. Two auditors shall from time to time be appointed by the corps, and a yearly meeting of the corps shall be held, at which an audited balance-sheet of receipts and expenditure shall be produced.

The foregoing rules were adopted at a meeting of the corps duly convened for the purpose, and held 19th July, 1864.
