FURTHER PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND DISSOLVING THE LEGISLATIVE
ASSEMBLY.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Parliament of Victoria now stands prorogued to Friday, the twenty-sixth day of August instant: And whereas the Legislative Assembly will shortly expire in accordance with the provisions of the Act passed in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to shorten the duration of the Legislative Assembly*, and it is expedient at once to dissolve the same: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power in me vested in this behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, discharge the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council, and the Members of the Legislative Assembly, from their meeting and attendance on the said Friday, the twenty-sixth day of August instant; and I do dissolve the Legislative Assembly, which is hereby dissolved accordingly. And inasmuch as it is desirable that Parliament should be summoned without delay, I do hereby declare that I have this day given Order that Writs be issued in due form, and according to law, for the election of Members to be duly returned to serve in the Legislative Assembly, which Writs are to be issued after notice thereof, and to be returnable on Monday, the seventh day of November in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
