COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the City of Melbourne and of the Borough of Kilmore and certain Road Boards have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to common-toll roads, viz.:—

The road known as "The Sydney Road," extending from its junction with Elizabeth street (near the first mile-post), in the city of Melbourne, to the northern boundary of the Willowmavin road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the city of Melbourne, the boroughs of Brunswick and of Kilmore, and the road districts designated respectively the Pentridge, the Broadmeadows, the Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan, and the Willowmavin road districts.

The road extending from the Braybrook Hotel to the western boundary of the city of Melbourne shall be a Common-toll road of the Braybrook road district and of the borough of Footscray.
