#### INCORPORATION OF HOSPITALS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1864.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor Mr. Francis Mr. Grant Mr. Sullivan Major-General Chute Mr. McCulloch Mr. Higinbotham Mr. Verdon

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions, it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fity persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the Government Gazette, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in No. 92.—September 9, 1864.—1.

Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received petitions signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the McIbourne Hospital and to the Daylesford Hospital respectively, praying that the said institutions may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petitions has been published in the Government Gazette, and no counterpetitions have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said several institutions to be bodies politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in manner following, that is to say:—

#### TRANSMISSION OF GOLD IN LETTERS THROUGH THE POST OFFICE.

WITH reference to the Regulations published at page 64 of the Government Gazette for 1857, attention is directed to the 27th and 32nd sections of the Post Office Statute, 1864. By the 27th section it is enacted that foreign letters posted in this colony, containing gold or silver either in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether mixed or not with any other substance or material, shall be transmitted to the General Post Office, and by the 32nd section such letters are to be destroyed, and their contents forfeited.

The regulations above referred to are therefore no longer in force.
