INCORPORATION OF HOSPITALS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1864.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in

Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received petitions signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the Melbourne Hospital and to the Daylesford Hospital respectively, praying that the said institutions may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petitions has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petitions have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said several institutions to be bodies politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Melbourne Hospital, situate in the city of Melbourne, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Melbourne Hospital."

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Daylesford Hospital, situate in the borough of Daylesford, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Daylesford Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TRANSMISSION OF GOLD IN LETTERS THROUGH THE POST OFFICE.

WITH reference to the Regulations published at page 64 of the *Government Gazette* for 1857, attention is directed to the 27th and 32nd sections of the *Post Office Statute*, 1864. By the 27th section it is enacted that foreign letters posted in this colony, containing gold or silver either in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether mixed or not with any other substance or material, shall be transmitted to the General Post Office, and by the 32nd section such letters are to be destroyed, and their contents forfeited.

The regulations above referred to are therefore no longer in force.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as hereinafter provided for, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

A COPY OF THE BYE-LAWS FOR THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

THE ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, on the first Thursday of every month, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the names of the councillors present shall be entered in the minute book, and the meeting shall be adjourned.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president, or in his absence by the acting president.
3. The order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—

- I. Reading copies of letters sent.
- II. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- III. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- IV. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and of officers.
- V. Orders of the day.
- VI. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
- VII. Examination of and passing accounts for payment.
- VIII. Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day; or at any future meeting, or if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such notice shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

9. Every councillor shall stand up while addressing the president.

10. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded, if so required by any councillor.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the

motion be negated, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained. But if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the council.

14. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, excepting by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

15. Every councillor when proposing a motion or amendment, or when speaking on any matter, shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided, the councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

16. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of five pounds for the offence.

17. Any councillor, by consent of the president, may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor, immediately upon the same being uttered.

18. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council, on giving notice of his intention so to do on the adoption of such resolution, and on such councillor entering such protest and his reason for protesting in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council: provided always that such protest may be expunged if decided by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth, or not to be in its terms respectful to the council.

19. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper, inviting applications for the same, nor unless the salary or allowance attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

20. All contracts shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, are to be entered in every case on the minutes of the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the tenderer, or some person for him or on his behalf, shall pay a deposit in the sum of Ten pounds per cent, on the amount of the contract, to the treasurer of the council; which amount so deposited shall be returned to the contractor when he obtains a final certificate from the surveyor that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

21. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the president and one other councillor, and countersigned by the treasurer, who shall also stamp such cheque; and no such cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is to be given shall have been passed at a meeting of the council.

22. The shire office shall be open on Thursday in every week, between Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Three o'clock in the afternoon, during which time the secretary shall be in attendance for the purpose of transacting the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall be in attendance during the hours of business, at every meeting of the council.

23. The valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine each rateable property within the shire, and shall, after having valued such property, thereupon deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof a notice, setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, together with other particulars necessary to describe the property, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuers.

24. The secretary, surveyor, rate collector, and other officers shall furnish or deliver official reports to the council at each ordinary meeting.

25. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the unanimous consent of the councillors present at any meeting.

The above Bye-laws were made by a Special Order of the Council, at a meeting held at the Shire Office, Winchelsea, on Thursday, the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
