WITH the view of affording facilities to persons resident on the gold fields and elsewhere, for transmitting by post to parts beyond the seas small quantities of gold without the necessity for entering such gold at any custom house, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of gold being examined at the places mentioned below, subject to the following regulations, in accordance with the 235th clause of The Customs Act 1857:—

Receipt and Pay Offices.

HEGULATIONS.

1. Duty will be received at any of the above Receipt and Pay Offices on small quantities of gold to be transmitted by post to parts beyond the seas. The quantity so forwarded may in no case exceed four ounces.

2. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this permission should present their gold, together with the letter or packet in which they intend to forward it, at a Receipt and Pay Office, and pay the amount of duty required.

3. As instructions have been given to the Receivers and Paymasters to seal and secure such packages containing the gold so be transmitted, and to certify to the quantity, all persons must be careful to observe that these letters or packages must in no cases be re-opened, otherwise they will subject themselves to a penalty and render the gold liable to forfeiture.

Section 27.

#### BYE-LAWS.

THE MELBOURNE AND HOBSON'S BAY UNITED RAILWAY

COMPANY.

THE Melbourne and Hobson's Bay United Railway Company, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in them for that purpose, do by this writing under their Common Seal make the following Bye-laws and Regulations, that is to

1. Melbourne time is to be observed .- Melbourne time is to be

2. Tickets not transferable.—Tickets belong to the company, and are not transferable. A ticket can only be used by the person for whom it may be issued.

3. Passengers not to rebook by same train.—No passenger shall be entitled to take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of travelling in any train if such train shall have arrived at such station.

4. Return tickets available only at certain stations.—Tickets, whether single or roturn, shall be available and shall be used by passengers only to convey them to the stations named thereon, or to any station short of that destination provided the passenger by so using a ticket derives no advantage as regards fare. In no case, however, shall the "cheap" or "excursion" tickets be used at or for any other station than those named thereon. Any person using, or attoupting to use, a ticket in violation of this bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Penalty for defacing tickets.—No ticket will be recognised by any collector or servant of the company authorised to collect or examine tickets, unless the number, date, and names of the stations printed on such ticket are perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket which may be defaced or rendered illegible in any of the above particulars will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
