THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS AT AVOCA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden. And whereas it is expedient to alter the time for holding the next Court of General Sessions at Avoca, appointed by a Proclamation bearing date the 19th day of December, 1864: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the next Court of General Sessions of the peace at Avoca to be holden on Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of October now next ensuing, in lieu of the time previously appointed therefor, viz., the sixth day of November.

WILLIAMSCHASE FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common. When one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Farmers' Common, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

WILLIAMSCHASE AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, for the use of selectors in the said area, shall comprise nine hundred and eighty-three acres three roods thirty perches,

county of Ripon, parish of Lalkaldarno, being allotments 62, 64, and 65, and the reserve adjoining allotment 83 on the north. —(65.L.9174).

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED:

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Buninyong.

REGULATIONS AS TO GOODS FORWARDED TO VICTORIA VIA ADELAIDE AND THE RIVER MURRAY.

THE following Abstract of Regulations published by the South Australian Government on the 11th day of January last, under which goods may be forwarded to Victoria via Adelaide and the River Murray, is published for general information.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN RIVER MURRAY PORTS.

THE following are the ports from which dutiable goods, or goods entered outwards for drawback, or for exportation under bond, may be shipped for the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria:—

- I. Port Goolwa.
- II. Port Milang.
- III. Port Mannum.
- IV. Port Blanche Town.

Merchants, agents, or others intending to ship any goods liable to duty in South Australia, New South Wales, or Victoria, at Ports Milang or Mannum, are hereby required to give the Collector of Customs at Port Adelaide, by either letter or telegram, forty-eight hours' clear notice, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, in order that an officer of customs may be in attendance.

Cereals, dairy and others articles of South Australian produce, not paying duty in New South Wales or Victoria, may be shipped at Port Mannum, without the attendance of an officer; entries for the goods so shipped must be passed at Port Blanche Town in the usual manner.

Goods intended to be landed at Ports Mannum or Milang, from vessels arriving from New South Wales or Victoria, if not liable to duty in this province, may be entered for landing before the sub-collector at Port Blanche Town, and the sub-collector may grant his warrant for the landing of such goods after such examination of the goods so entered for either Port Mannum or Port Milang, as he may deem necessary.

No dutiable goods may be landed at either Port Mannum or Port Milang without the presence of an officer of customs, but duty on such goods may be paid at Port Blanche Town, and such goods may then be removed from Port Blanche Town to either Ports Mannum or Milang under the regulations applicable to vessels trading coastwise.

TARIFFS.

The duties to be paid on goods exported to New South Wales, not being entered outwards from the warehouse for exportation under bond, or for drawback for duty paid in this province under the tariff of this province, shall be in accordance with the tariff in operation on the date on which these regulations come into force, or under such tariff as exists in New South Wales from time to time, or under such tariff as may be mutually agreed upon between the Government of this province and the Government of New South Wales.

The duties to be paid on goods exported to Victoria, not being entered outwards from the warehouse for exportation under bond, or for drawback for duty paid in this province under the tariff of this province, shall be in accordance with the tariff in operation at the date of these regulations coming into force, or under such tariff as may exist in Victoria from time to time, or under such tariff as may be mutually agreed upon between the Government of this province and the Government of Victoria.

The duty to be paid on all goods imported from the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria into this province shall be in accordance with the tariff in operation for the time being.

EXPORT OF GOODS AND COLLECTION OF REVENUE.

Merchants, agents, and others entering goods outwards for exportation on duty-paid entry for the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria, shall pay the full amount of the duty leviable under the tariffs of the respective colonies, unless the amount of duty payable under the South Australian tariff shall have been paid, in which case the amount so paid under the South Australian tariff shall be carried to the credit of the merchant, agent, or other person entering the goods; but should the duty on such goods be in excess of the duty payable under the South Australian tariff, such excess or difference shall be paid by the merchant, agent, or other person so entering the goods.

And where the South Australian duty-paid shall be in excess of the duty leviable on goods exported to New South Wales or Victoria under a duty-paid entry, the excess or difference may be recovered as "drawback" by the merchant, agent, or other person, under the regulations hereinafter provided.

EXPORTATION OF GOODS FROM A BONDED WAREHOUSE UNDER BOND.

Goods liable to duty under either the South Australian, New South Wales, or Victorian tariff, may be exported from the bonded warehouses at the River Murray ports to ports on the said River Murray under bond.

Goods may be cleared from the bonded warehouses at Port Adelaide and transported overland to any River Murray port, thence to be exported to New South Wales or Victoria, or to be placed in a bonded store at a River Murray port in this province, or otherwise accounted for to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs at Port Adelaide.

GOODS EXPORTED UNDER DRAWBACK.

Goods may be exported for drawback from River Murray ports in this province to the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria via the River Murray.

GOODS FOR TRANSHIPMENT.

Goods may be transhipped from any vessel from any over-sea port to any ships bound to any port in New South Wales or Victoria in the River Murray, but such goods shall be entered for a bonded warehouse, or constructively warehoused, and shall be examined by an officer of customs of this province; and such goods, after such examination, may be entered for exportation under bond, in the same manner as goods may be cleared under these regulations.
