## SUPPLYING COALS, ETC., TO WAR VESSELS OF NORTH AMERICAN BELLIGERENTS.

THE Governor has directed the publication of the annexed Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and its enclosed Notice relating to the supplies of Coals to War Vessels of the North American Belligerents therein specified:—

Downing street, 15th November, 1864.

SIR,—I transmit to you herewith a copy of a letter from the Treasury (13th October, 1864), with a copy of a printed notice (8th October, 1864), which, at the request of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, their Lordships have caused to be issued by the Commissioner of Customs, in regard to the supply of coals to war vessels of the belligerents.

The statute 18 & 19 Victoria, cap. 96, referred to in the notice, applies only to the United Kingdom, and not to the colonies; but you will put into operation such laws bearing upon this subject as may be in force within the colony under your government.

Earl Russell's letter of the 31st January, 1862, referred to in the enclosed notice, was communicated to you in the circular despatch from this department of the 1st of February, 1862.

### NOTICE.

Custom House, London, 8th October, 1864.

The Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs having received information that a cargo of coal had been shipped on board a vessel at a British port without due clearance by the proper officers of customs at the port of shipment, and that such coals had been laden at sea on board a ship of war of the United States of America, with which certain states styled the Confederate States of America are now at war:

The said Commissioners hereby give notice that by the 14th section of *The Customs Consolidation Act, 1853*, it is enacted that if any goods shall be shipped, put off, or water-borne to be shipped, without being duly cleared, or otherwise contrary to the provisions of that Act, the same shall be liable to forfeiture; and by section 11 of 18 and 19 Victoria, chapter 96, if any ship having cargo on board depart from any port without being duly cleared, the master shall forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds.

And the said Commissioners hereby further give notice that in all similar cases of shipment for either of the belligerent powers in violation of the regulations contained in Earl Russell's letter of 31st January, 1862, the law above quoted will be strictly enforced.

In accordance with the instructions conveyed in the foregoing despatch of 15th November, 1864, it is hereby notified that the law relating to the illegal shipment of cargo, or illegal departure of vessels, will be strictly enforced. The following clauses of *The Customs Act, 1857*, in force in Victoria, applicable to this case, are published for general information:—

116. *Time of clearance.*—The collector shall not be compelled or compellable to grant a clearance outwards of any ship unless all the documents or papers of such ship, duly completed and certified where necessary, shall have been deposited at the Custom House of the port at or before the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon on the day of clearance; but nothing herein contained shall prevent the collector from granting, if he shall think fit, such clearance on any day, although such documents or papers shall not have been deposited before the hour aforesaid; and if any ship shall depart without such clearance, the master thereof shall forfeit any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds nor less than Twenty pounds.

117. *Forfeiture of goods on non-shipment or illegal shipment.*—If any goods liable to duty on importation or taken from the warehouse to be exported, or entitled to drawback on exportation, which are enumerated in the content of any ship, shall not be duly shipped before the departure of such ship, or shall not be duly certified by the proper officer as short-shipped, such goods shall be forfeited; or if any such goods shall be taken on board such ship not being enumerated in such content, the master of the ship shall forfeit the sum of Five pounds in respect of every package of such goods; and if any goods duly shipped on board such ship shall be landed at any other place than that for which they shall have been cleared, unless otherwise accounted for to the satisfaction of the commissioner, the master of such ship shall forfeit a sum equal to treble the value of the goods so landed; and if any goods shall be shipped or water-borne to be shipped without being duly cleared or otherwise contrary to this Act, the same shall be forfeited.

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON AND THE VICINITY.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by proclamation see fit to direct: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of February, in the year 1862, the said Act was declared to apply to and be in force in the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington: And whereas it is expedient to increase the area to which the said Act shall apply: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as limits the operation of the said Act to the said municipal district, now called the Borough of Essendon and Flemington; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the district, the limits and boundaries of which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

THE DISTRICT OF FLEMINGTON (INCLUDING ESSENDON, HAWSTEAD, AND KENSINGTON)—Commencing at a point on the Moonee-moonee Ponds intersected by the southern boundary of section 15, in the parish of Dousta Galla; thence west to the south-western angle of the said section 15; thence south to the south-western angle of portion D of section 6, in the said parish of Dousta Galla; thence west to the Saltwater River; thence southwards by the said river and the north-eastern boundary of the municipal district of Footscray to the north-eastern angle of the town reserve of Footscray; thence east to the western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham; and thence northwards by the said western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham and by the Moonee-moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE BARRARBOOL ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of January, 1865.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district hereinafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony,

bearing date the twenty-fourth day of December, 1853, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Barrarbool Road District," and the boundaries of the said road district, as at present existing, are defined in another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, 1863: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Barrarbool Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE CREES SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Gnarwarre; thence north by the west boundary of that parish to the centre of the Barwon River; thence easterly by the centre of that river to the north-west angle of section 25, parish of Barrarbool; thence east to the north-east angle of the said section; thence by the east boundary of sections 25, 11, and 7 of the said parish and a direct line south to the centre of the Waurin Chain of Ponds; thence westerly by the centre of the Waurin Chain of Ponds to the intersection of the east boundary of section 1, parish of Barrarbool; thence south by the said east boundary of section 1 to its south-east angle; thence due west to and by the south boundary of the parish of Gnarwarre to the commencing point.

THE MORIAC SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Modewarre; thence north by the west boundary of said parish to its north-west angle; thence east by the north boundary of the same parish and part of the south boundary of the parish of Barrarbool to the north-east angle of section B 1, in the parish of Dunneed; thence north to and by the east boundary of section 1, parish of Barrarbool, to the centre of the Waurin Chain of Ponds; thence easterly by the centre of the said chain of ponds to the point of intersection of three roads opposite the north-west angle of section 16, parish of Dunneed; thence south-westerly by the centre of a one-chain road to a point opposite the north-west angle of section 22, parish of Dunneed; thence by the said centre line to the north boundary of McKinlay's pre-emptive right; thence southerly and westerly by the same centre line to the centre of Thompson's Creek; thence westerly by the centre line of the said creek to the eastern boundary of section 3, parish of Modewarre; thence south to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

THE COAST SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Jan Juc; thence north by the west boundary of the parishes of Jan Juc and Parapara to the centre of Thompson's Creek; thence easterly by the centre of Thompson's Creek to the centre of a one-chain road running through McKinlay's pre-emptive right; thence north-easterly by the centre of the said road to the point of intersection of three roads opposite the north-west angle of section 16, parish of Dunneed; thence south by the centre of a road forming the west boundary of the same section to the intersection of the centre of a road forming the south boundary of sections 16, 15, 14, and 13, of the last-named parish; thence due east to a point opposite the dividing line of portions A and B, in the parish of Conewarre; thence due south by the said division and a direct line to the sea-coast; thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the centre of Salt Creek; thence by the Salt Creek north-westerly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
