## ARDGRAY TEMPORARY COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act* 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Ardgray, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The allotments and pieces of land hereinafter mentioned, comprising an area of 14,897 acres, shall be and constitute the Farmers' Common for the use of the selectors and lessees above named, viz.:—Parish of Wyuna, allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 1; A and 2, section 2; 1, 2, 4, 5, and A, section 3; section 4; allotments 1, 2a, 3a, and 4, section 5; A and 3, section 8; A and 2a, section 9; 1a and 3b, section 10; 3, section 11; sections 12 and 14; allotments 1, 2, and 3, section 18; 2, 3a, 4, and 5, section 19; 1, 2, and A, section 20; A, 3, and 4, section 21; 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 22; 1, section 23; 3, section 24; A and 1, section 25; 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 26; section 27; allotments A and 3, section 28; A and 4, section 29; 1, 2, and 3, section 30; 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 31; 1 and 2, section 32; 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 33; sections 34 and 35; allotment 4a, section 36; 3b, section 37; and 2, section 39; a reserve on the east of allotment A of section 9; a reserve on the north-west of section 25; and a reserve in section 27.—(65.K.9901.)

## COMMONS.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

**BEECHWORTH UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD FIELD COMMON.**—The United Borough and Gold Field Common of Beechworth, described in a Proclamation bearing date 2nd March, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the portion of land hereinafter described, and comprising 1700 acres, more or less: Commencing at the south-western angle of the existing common; bounded thence by the southern boundary thereof, bearing easterly, north-easterly, and easterly to the south-east angle thereof; thence south by a line to the summit of a range; thence by that range south-westerly to a point thereon bearing south from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing north.—(65.K.6501.)

**TARNAGULLA BOROUGH COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the borough of Tarnagulla, comprising an area of 4600 acres, shall be and constitute a Common for all householders in the said borough of Tarnagulla.—(65.L.8598.)

**TARNAGULLA FARMERS' COMMON.**—The boundaries of the Tarnagulla Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date 4th April, 1861, are hereby altered in accordance with the following description, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 2 of section 5, parish of Tarnagulla; thence by the south-east boundary of the borough of Tarnagulla, bearing S. 49° 31' W. ninety-one chains fifty-one links; thence south to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of the Janevale pre-emptive section; thence by a line and the north boundary of that section bearing east to the Loddon River; thence by that river northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 14, section 5; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 3 of the said section; and thence north to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage, 3300 acres.—(62.E.10659.)

**TARNAGULLA GOLD FIELD COMMON.**—The Tarnagulla Gold Field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date 26th October, 1863, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portions thereof lying within the borough of Tarnagulla, and adjoining the said borough on the south-east, and containing an area of 2294 acres, the boundaries of which are described as follows, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of the township of Tarnagulla; thence by the north-west boundary of the borough of Tarnagulla, bearing N. 54° 30' E. three hundred and eleven chains fifty-four links to the north-west angle of the township of Newbridge; thence by the west boundary of that township and the west boundaries of allotments 39 and 40 of section 4, and 1 and 2 of section 5, parish of Tarnagulla, bearing south one hundred and eighty chains ninety-one links to a point bearing east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line and the north boundary of the township of Tarnagulla, bearing west two hundred and fifty-three chains sixty-two links.—(63.G.6452.)

**YAMBUK TOWN COMMON.**—The Yambuk Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date 6th March, 1865, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of allotment 1 of section B, parish of Codrington, county of Villiers, containing 430 acres.—(65.L.8688.)

TENDERS are hereby invited and will be received until Noon of Wednesday, the 25th October, 1865, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, as undermentioned, for one year, from the 1st January, 1866, to 31st December, 1866.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Deputy Postmaster General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender Box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance if delivered at the address named in the tender shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service, but notwithstanding this condition any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
