## TAKING TIMBER, BARK, STONE, ETC., FROM THE SANDHURST, INGLEWOOD, AND LODDON DISTRICT TRAMWAY RESERVE PROHIBITED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from the portions of Crown lands temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 14th August, 1865, as the Parliamentary endowment of 21,000 acres for the purposes of the Sandhurst, Inglewood, and Loddon District Tramway Company, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th of August, 1865.

## INVERLEIGH TOWN COMMON INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE INVERLEIGH TOWN COMMON described in a Proclamation bearing date 19th August, 1862, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of sixty-two acres three roods thirty-three perches, being allotment 83, and the unappropriated portion of allotment 54, in the parish of Dorog.—(65.K.9686.)

## WARRANOOK FARMERS' COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Farmers' Common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Warranook, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—4800 acres, more or less, in the parish of Warranook, being allotments 3 to 7 both inclusive, 95, 101 to 111 both inclusive, 118 to 126 both inclusive, 175, 177 to 180 both inclusive, 197 to 204 both inclusive,

F. J. K. L. and a reserve adjoining allotment 95 on the south.—  
(65.L.11053.)

#### NEW ZEALAND.—"THE DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861."

THE following Proclamation, issued by His Honor the  
Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, is pub-  
lished for general information.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor SAMUEL BEALEY, Esq., Superintendent of the  
Province of Canterbury, declaring certain districts to be  
infected under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

WHEREAS by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was provided  
that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand,  
from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Pro-  
vince within the said colony, all or any of the powers vested in  
the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to  
such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time  
to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the said Governor  
hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of  
New Zealand, delegated to SAMUEL BEALEY, Esquire, so long  
as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of  
Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by  
the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of  
the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act pro-  
vided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in  
Council on the eighteenth day of September, One thousand  
eight hundred and sixty-five, and to any other regulations to be  
from time to time duly made.

Now, therefore, I, SAMUEL BEALEY, by virtue of such powers  
in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare, that after the  
date hereof, the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the  
colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of  
South Australia, and Western Australia, as well as the colony  
of Tasmania, and the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the  
islands of Great Britain and Ireland; the several provinces of  
the colony of New Zealand, that is to say, the provinces of  
Otago, of Southland in the Middle Island, and the province of  
Auckland in the North Island, shall be deemed to be infected  
districts within the meaning of the said Act; and that no cattle  
shall be imported from the said districts into the province of  
Canterbury: And I do further proclaim and declare the follow-  
ing regulations for the destruction of diseased cattle, and for  
the preventing the removal or transportation of cattle from the  
said several infected districts into the province of Canterbury.

1. If any person shall drive or remove or cause to be driven  
or removed, or assist in driving or removing any cattle from  
either of the said infected districts into the province of Canter-  
bury, such person shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds for  
every head of cattle so driven into the province of Canterbury.

2. It shall be lawful for any inspector of cattle, or police  
constable, to destroy or cause to be destroyed any cattle which  
shall pass into this province from either of the said districts.

3. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any  
inspector or any police constable acting under the authority  
of these regulations, every person so offending shall and may be  
seized and detained by such person so acting as aforesaid, or any  
person or persons he may call to his assistance, until such  
offender or offenders can be taken before two Justices of the  
Peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds.

## MINING AUTHORISED ON EXEMPTED LAND IN THE PARISH OF LEICHARDT.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the holders of miners' rights to mine upon and within the lands set apart as a water reserve, being allotment No. IV of section No. XIII, parish of Leichardt, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, and no tents or huts shall be erected thereon.

2. On ceasing to mine the miners shall fill up all shafts and excavations made by them, and remove all debris, clay, and gravel, and leave the surface of the ground in as good a condition as before the commencement of mining operations.

3. The miners shall not, nor will interfere with, or injure the water-channel partly bounding the said reserve, nor pollute the water therein, nor interfere with the right of full and free access thereto by the public.

4. The miners shall not nor will conduct their operations in such a manner as to injure the road adjoining the said reserve.

5. After a miner shall have marked out his claim, and before he shall have commenced to work, he shall deposit in the hands of the warden's clerk the sum of Five pounds sterling, as a guarantee that he will observe and fulfil these conditions; and this sum shall be held by the warden's clerk until the miner who has made such deposit shall relinquish the claim held by him. If the conditions be fulfilled, then and in such case the whole sum shall be returned to the depositor; but if any of the conditions be not fulfilled, the whole of the said sum shall be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the reservoir shall be defrayed out of the moneys so deposited.

6. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate any of the above conditions it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon any claim upon or within the lands above described.

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit receipt, cash deposit, Guarantee Society's bond or sureties; if the latter, the tender must be accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties; and in either case the bond must be executed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which, the contract may be again advertised at the risk of the tenderer, or another tender accepted. #### CONDITIONS.

1. Every article to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, and subject to approval, and should articles of any particular manufacture be ordered, the same are to be furnished at the rates set forth in the contract.

2. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the secretary.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under these contracts not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the railway storekeeper, on the order of the secretary, to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the railway storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

10. The railway storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the railway storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

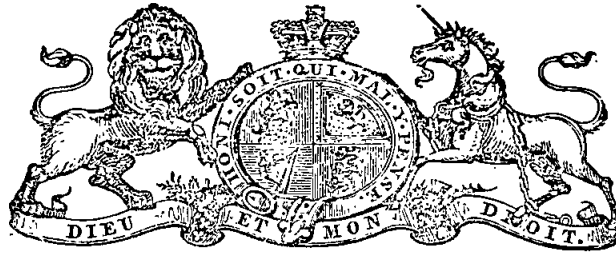

NOTE.—The allotments specified above will be sold subject to the following special conditions in addition to the ordinary conditions of sale:—
