### GREETING:

**W**HEREAS it has been deemed of public advantage to Victoria and the adjacent Colonies that a Series of Exhibitions of General Industries and Art be held in succession in the several Australian Colonies, the first of such Exhibitions to be held in the city of Melbourne, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six: Now know you, that We, reposing special trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have thought fit to constitute and appoint, and by these presents do constitute and appoint, you, Sir Redmond Barry, Knight; the Honorable George Harker; the Honorable George Frederic Verdon; the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan; the Honorable Sir James Frederick Palmer, Knight; the Honorable Caleb Joshua Jenner; the Honorable William Degraives; the Honorable Sir Francis Murphy, Knight; Samuel Henry Bindon, Esquire; John Carre Riddell, Esquire; John Thomas Smith, Esquire; Edward Cope, Esquire; J. J. Bleasdale, D.D.; Thomas Black, Esquire; Ferdinand Mueller, Esquire; Frederick McCoy, Esquire; Phipps Turnbull, Esquire; Charles Edward Bright, Esquire; Theophilus J. Sumner, Esquire; and Robert McDougall, Esquire; to be our Commissioners for managing and conducting all or any of the matters or things which may be necessary or in any manner relate to or concern the said Exhibition: And We do also constitute and appoint the said Sir Redmond Barry, Knight, to be President of our said Commission: And We will and ordain that you our said Commissioners shall have the entire control, conduct, and management of the said Exhibition, and of the funds that may be granted thereto or arise therefrom, subject however to such special directions as may by us be deemed necessary: And We hereby give power to our said Commissioners, if they think fit, to distribute prizes to exhibitors, and to do all matters and things connected with such distribution; and also to receive and take such sums of money as they may direct for entrance to the said Exhibition, and to dispose of all moneys which shall come to their hands as they shall think fit in and towards the purposes of the said Exhibition or otherwise in the execution of the powers hereby given to them, including the payment of expenses, charges, and liabilities, which they may incur or become subject to, and generally to do all matters and things that may be necessary or expedient for promoting the ends and designs of the said Exhibition, subject to such special directions as aforesaid: And We do hereby give you our said Commissioners full power and authority to nominate such persons as you may deem fit to act as Local Commissioners to aid and assist in managing and conducting all or any of the matters and things hereby authorized to be done by our Commissioners: And We further will and ordain that the services of our said Commissioners shall be rendered gratuitously, but We direct that our Commissioners may, out of the funds, allow and pay to such officers and persons who may aid them in the conduct of such Exhibition such salaries and gratuities or other remuneration as they may think fit.

Witness our trusty and well-beloved **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of our Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c., at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-ninth year of our reign.

TREATY OF COMMERCE BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE ZOLLVEREIN.

THE accompanying copy of a Treaty of Commerce between Her Majesty and the Zollverein, which has been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

TREATY OF COMMERCE BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE ZOLLVEREIN.

Signed at Berlin, 30th May, 1865.  
[Ratifications exchanged at Berlin, 30th June, 1865.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the one part; and His Majesty the King of Prussia in his own name, and representing the sovereign States and territories united to the Prussian system of Customs and contributions, that is to say, the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, the enclaves of the Grand Duchy of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, Rostow, Netzeband, and Schönberg, the Principality of Birkenfeld belonging to the Grand Duchy of Oldenburg, the Duchy of Anhalt, the Principalities of Waldeck and Pyrmont, the Principality of Lippe, and the Grand Bailiwick of Meisenheim belonging to the Landgraviate of Hesse, as well as in the name of the other members of the German Association of customs and commerce, that is to say, the Crown of Bavaria, the Crown of Saxony, the Crown of Hanover, as well for itself as for the Principality of Schaumburg-Lippe, and the Crown of Württemberg, the Grand Duchy of Baden, the Electorate of Hesse, the Grand Duchy of Hesse, as well for itself as for the Bailiwick of Homburg belonging to the Landgraviate of Hesse, the States forming the Customs and Commercial Union of Thuringia, viz., the Grand Duchy of Saxony, the Duchies of Saxe-Meiningen, of Saxe-Altenburg, of Saxe-Coburg-Gotha, the Principalities of Schwarzburg-Rudolstadt and of Schwarzburg-Sondershausen, of the elder branch of Reuss, and of the younger branch of Reuss, the Duchy of Brunswick, the Duchy of Oldenburg, the Duchy of Nassau, and the free town of Frankfurt, on the other part;

Being equally animated by the desire of regulating and extending the commercial relations between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and its dependencies, and the Zollverein, have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say,

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honorable Francis Baron Napier of Merchiston, a Peer of Scotland, a Baronet of Nova Scotia, a member of Her Britannic Majesty's Privy Council, Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Prussia, &c.; and John Ward, Esquire, Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires and Consul-General to the Hanse Towns, and Consul-General in Hanover, Oldenburg, &c.;

And His Majesty the King of Prussia, M. Otto Eduard Leopold von Bismarck-Schönhausen, President of his Ministry of State, and Minister of Foreign Affairs; M. Johann Friedrich von Pommer-Esche, his Actual Privy Councillor; M. Alexander Maximilian Philipsborn, Director in his Ministry of Foreign Affairs; and M. Martin Friedrich Rudolph Delbrück, Director in his Ministry for Commerce, Trade, and Public Works;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found to be in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:

ARTICLE I.  
The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty who dwell either temporarily or permanently in the States of the Zollverein and the subjects of the States of the Zollverein who dwell either temporarily or permanently in the dominions or possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy therein, in respect to the exercise of commerce and trades, the same rights as, and be subjected to no higher or other taxes than, the subjects of any third country the most favored in those respects.

ARTICLE II.  
The produce and manufactures of the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty which may be imported into the Zollverein, and the produce and manufactures of the States of the Zollverein which may be imported into the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; whether intended for consumption, warehousing, re-exportation, or transit, shall therein be treated in the same manner as, and in particular shall be subject to no higher or other duties than, the produce and manufactures of any third country the most favored in those respects.

ARTICLE III.  
No other or higher duties shall be levied in the Zollverein on the exportation of any goods to the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, nor in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty on the exportation of any goods to the Zollverein, than are or may be levied on the exportation of the like goods to any third country the most favored in that respect.

ARTICLE IV.  
The transit of goods to and from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland shall be free from all transit duties in the Zollverein, and the transit of goods to and from the Zollverein shall be free from all transit duties in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

IHRE Majestät die Königin des Vereinigten Königreiches von Grossbritannien und Irland, einer Seits; und Seine Majestät der König von Preussen, sowohl für Sich und in Vertretung der Ihrem Zoll- und Steuersystem angeschlossenen souverainen Länder und Ländtheile, nämlich: des Grossherzogthums Luxemburg, der Grossherzoglich Mecklenburgischen Enklaven Rostow, Netzeband und Schönberg, des Grossherzoglich Oldenburgischen Fürstenthums Birkenfeld, des Herzogthums Anhalt, der Fürstenthümer Waldeck und Pyrmont, des Fürstenthums Lippe und des Landgräfllich Hessischen Oberamtes Meisenheim, als im Namen der übrigen Mitglieder des Deutschen Zoll- und Handelsvereins, nämlich: der Krone Bayern, der Krone Sachsen, der Krone Hannover, sowohl für Sich wie für das Fürstenthum Schaumburg-Lippe, und der Krone Württemberg, des Grossherzogthums Baden, des Kurfürstenthums Hessen, des Grossherzogthums Hessen, sowohl für Sich wie für das Landgräfllich Hessische Amt Homburg, der den Thüringischen Zoll- und Handelsverein bildenden Staaten, namentlich: des Grossherzogthums Sachsen, der Herzogthümer Sachsen-Meiningen, Sachsen-Altenburg, Sachsen-Cyburg und Gotha, der Fürstenthümer Schwarzburg-Rudolstadt und Schwarzburg-Sondershausen, Reuss älterer und Reuss jüngerer Linie, des Herzogthums Braunschweig, des Herzogthums Oldenburg, des Herzogthums Nassau und der freien Stadt Frankfurt, anderer Seits;

Von dem gleichen Wunsche geleitet, die Handels-Beziehungen zwischen dem Vereinigten Königreiche von Grossbritannien und Irland und den ihm angehörenden Gebieten und dem Zollvereine zu regeln und auszudehnen, haben beschossen, einen Vertrag zu diesem Zwecke abzuschliessen, und zu Ihren Bevollmächtigten ernannt, nämlich:

Ihre Majestät die Königin des Vereinigten Königreiches von Grossbritannien und Irland: den sehr ehrenwerthen Francis Baron Napier von Merchiston, Pair von Schottland und Baronet von Nova Scotia, Mitglied Ihrer Britischen Majestät Geheimen Rathes, Ihrer Majestät ausserordentlichen und bevollmächtigten Botschafter bei Seiner Majestät dem Könige von Preussen, &c.; und den Herrn John Ward, Ihrer Majestät Geschäfts-träger und General-Consul bei den Hansestädten und General-Consul in Hannover, Oldenburg, &c.;

Und Seine Majestät der König von Preussen: den Herrn Otto Eduard Leopold von Bismarck-Schönhausen, Allerhöchst Ihren Präsidenten des Staatsministeriums und Minister der auswärtigen Angelegenheiten; den Herrn Johann Friedrich von Pommer-Esche, Allerhöchst Ihren Wirklichen Geheimen Rath; den Herrn Alexander Maximilian Philipsborn, Allerhöchst Ihren Director im Ministerium der auswärtigen Angelegenheiten; den Herrn Martin Friedrich Rudolph Delbrück, Allerhöchst Ihren Director im Ministerium für Handel, Gewerbe und öffentliche Arbeiten;

Welche, nach gegenseitiger Mittheilung ihrer in guter und gehöriger Form befundenen Vollmachten, die nachstehenden Artikel vereinbart und abgeschlossen haben:

ARTIKEL I.  
Die Unterthanen Ihrer Britischen Majestät, welche in den Staaten des Zollvereins, und die Unterthanen der Staaten des Zollvereins, welche in den Gebieten oder Besetzungen Ihrer Britischen Majestät, vorübergehend oder dauernd sich aufhalten, sollen daselbst in Beziehung auf den Betrieb des Handels und der Gewerbe die nämlichen Rechte geniessen, und keinen höheren oder anderen Abgaben unterworfen werden, als die Angehörigen des in diesen Beziehungen am meisten begünstigten dritten Landes.

ARTIKEL II.  
Die Boden- und Gewerbs-Erzeugnisse der Gebiete und Besetzungen Ihrer Britischen Majestät, welche in den Zollverein, und die Boden- und Gewerbs-Erzeugnisse der Staaten des Zollvereins welche in das Vereinigte Königreich von Grossbritannien und Irland eingeführt werden, sollen daselbst, sie mögen zum Verbrauch, zur Lagerung, zur Wiederausfuhr oder zur Durchfuhr bestimmt sein, der nämlichen Behandlung unterliegen, und insbesondere keinen höheren oder anderen Abgaben unterworfen werden, als die Erzeugnisse des in diesen Beziehungen am meisten begünstigten dritten Landes.

ARTIKEL III.  
Bei der Ausfuhr nach den Gebieten und Besitzungen Ihrer Britischen Majestät, sollen im Zollverein, und bei der Ausfuhr nach dem Zollverein, sollen in den Gebieten und Besetzungen Ihrer Britischen Majestät, Ausgangs-Abgaben von keinen anderen Waaren und mit keinem höheren oder anderen Betrage erhoben werden, als bei der Ausfuhr nach dem in dieser Beziehung am meisten begünstigten dritten Lande.

ARTIKEL IV.  
Die Waaren-Durchfuhr nach und von dem Vereinigten Königreiche von Grossbritannien und Irland soll im Zollverein, und die Waaren-Durchfuhr nach und von dem Zollverein, soll in dem Vereinigten Königreiche von Grossbritannien und Irland von jeder Durchgangs-Abgabe frei sein.

## ARTICLE V.

Any favor, privilege, or reduction in the tariff of duties of importation or exportation, which either of the contracting parties may concede to any third power, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other.

No prohibition of importation or exportation shall be established by either of them against the other, which shall not at the same time be applicable to all other nations.

The contracting parties engage not to prohibit the exportation of coal, and to levy no duty upon such exportation.

The preceding provisions respecting the prohibition of exportation shall not invalidate the obligations which the constitution of the Germanic Confederation imposes on the German States which compose the Zollverein.

## ARTICLE VI.

With regard to the marks or labels of goods, or of their packages, and also with regard to patterns and marks of manufacture and trade, the subjects of the States of the Zollverein shall enjoy in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty shall enjoy in the States of the Zollverein, the same protection as native subjects.

## ARTICLE VII.

The stipulations of the preceding Articles I. to VI. shall also be applied to the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty. In those colonies and possessions the produce of the States of the Zollverein shall not be subject to any higher or other import duties than the produce of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of any other country, of the like kind; nor shall the exportation from those colonies or possessions to the Zollverein be subject to any higher or other duties than the exportation to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

## ARTICLE VIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force on the 1st of July, 1865, and shall remain in force until the 30th of June, 1877. In case neither of the contracting parties shall, twelve months before the last-mentioned day, have given notice to the other of the intention to terminate the operation of the Treaty, then the same shall continue in force until the expiration of one year from the day upon which either of the contracting parties shall have given notice to the other to terminate the same.

## ARTICLE IX.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications thereof shall be exchanged at Berlin in three weeks, or sooner if possible.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms. Done at Berlin, the thirtieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

## ARTIKEL V.

Jede Begünstigung, jedes Vorrecht oder jede Ermässigung in dem Tarif der Eingangs- und Ausgangs-Abgaben, welche einer der vertragenden Theile einer dritten Macht zugestehen möchte, wird gleichzeitig und ohne Bedingung dem anderen zu Theil werden.

Ferner wird keiner der vertragenden Theile ein Einfuhr- oder ein Ausfuhr-Verbot gegen den anderen in Kraft setzen, welches nicht gleichzeitig auf alle anderen Nationen Anwendung fände.

Die vertragenden Theile verpflichten sich, die Ausfuhr von Steinkohlen weder zu verbieten, noch mit einer Abgabe zu belagen.

Die vorstehenden auf Ausfuhr-Verbote bezüglichen Bestimmungen sollen den, aus dem Bundesverhältnisse herrührenden Verpflichtungen der zum Zollverein gehörenden Deutschen Bundesstaaten keinen Eintrag thun.

## ARTIKEL VI.

In Betreff der Bezeichnung oder Etikettirung der Waaren oder deren Verpackung, der Muster und der Fabrik- oder Handelszeichen, sollen die Unterthanen der Staaten des Zollvereins in dem Vereinigten Königreiche von Grossbritannien und Irland, und die Unterthanen Ihrer Britischen Majestät in den Staaten des Zollvereins denselben Schutz wie die Inländer geniessen.

## ARTIKEL VII.

Die in den vorstehenden Artikeln I. bis VI. getroffenen Bestimmungen finden auch auf die Kolonien und auswärtigen Besitzungen Ihrer Britischen Majestät Anwendung. In diesen Kolonien und Besitzungen sollen die Erzeugnisse der Staaten des Zollvereins keinen höheren oder anderen Eingangs-Abgaben unterliegen, als die gleichartigen Erzeugnisse des Vereinigten Königreichs von Grossbritannien und Irland, oder irgend eines anderen Landes, und es soll die Ausfuhr aus diesen Kolonien oder Besitzungen nach dem Zollverein keinen höheren oder anderen Abgaben unterworfen werden, als die Ausfuhr nach dem Vereinigten Königreiche von Grossbritannien und Irland.

## ARTIKEL VIII.

Der gegenwärtige Vertrag soll am 1 Juli 1865, in Kraft treten und bis zum 30 Juni 1877 in Kraft bleiben. Im Falle keiner der vertragenden Theile zwölf Monate vor diesem Tage seine Absicht, die Wirkung des Vertrages aufhören zu lassen, dem anderen kund gegeben haben sollte, soll derselbe bis zum Ablauf eines Jahres von dem Tage ab in Geltung bleiben, an welchem der eine oder der andere der vertragenden Theile denselben gekündigt hat.

## ARTIKEL IX.

Der gegenwärtige Vertrag soll ratifizirt, und es sollen die Ratifikations-Urkunden binnen drei Wochen oder, wenn möglich, früher in Berlin ausgewechselt werden.

Zu Urkund dessen haben die beiderseitigen Bevollmächtigten denselben unterzeichnet und ihre Siegel beigedrückt. So geschehen zu Berlin, den dreissigsten Mai, im Jahre des Herren Eintausend acht-hundert und fünf und sechszig.

## THE BOROUGH OF STEIGLITZ.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of October, 1865.

WHEREAS by The Municipal Corporations Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as hereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of

the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be, and be deemed to be, a "borough" hereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been presented to the Governor by inhabitant householders resident at Steiglitz, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the nineteenth day of September in the present year: And whereas no petition in opposition to the above-mentioned petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF STEIGLITZ.—Commencing from a point on the road leading south from the present township of Steiglitz to Geelong below that known as the Red Hill cutting to a point north of the Quartz Gold-Reefs known as "the Buckingham" and "the Homeward-bound," a distance of four and a half miles north by one mile west of the Court House on the present township of Steiglitz by one mile east of the same; a centre line passing through the said Court House to the point on the road south and to the point on the before-mentioned Quartz Gold-Reefs north measuring four and a half miles shall be the length of the said area of the municipality; and one mile east and one mile west of this line through its whole length shall be the breadth of the said municipality east and west.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 219), intituled, *An Act to consolidate the Law relating to Gaols*, it is amongst other things enacted that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols"), respectively, of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of October, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the gaol at Sale was, amongst others, proclaimed: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the area of the said gaol: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as refers to the said gaol at Sale: and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the gaol at Sale situate on the land hereinafter described is a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

##### IRON CASTINGS.

TENDERS will be received until Noon on Wednesday, the 1st day of November, 1865, from persons willing to furnish Iron Castings, in such quantities as may be required for the Government Railways, from 1st January until the 31st December, 1866.

The castings are required for locomotive engine work, carriage work, &c.

Whenever specially ordered, the castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron," and of such particular brand,

quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the Locomotive Superintendent, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfection, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered, the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same; and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and cleaned. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Melbourne Station there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost of carriage.

Whenever ordered the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Government will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Melbourne Station free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing, and no cost for carriage from Speer street Station to the contractor's place of business will be allowed.

5. The contractor must furnish with each delivery detailed invoices or bills or parcels, in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order of the goods, otherwise they will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time.

6. The contractor will prepare his own account on the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Engineer-in-Chief, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

9. The Locomotive Superintendent will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

10. Irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Locomotive Superintendent, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and it will be in the power of the Government, upon repetition of such irregularities, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving a notice in writing of full three calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month; and within the period for which the contract is made.
