# PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIE CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Vic-toria, &c., &c.

WHERAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with rezard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of June, 1863, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Waranga Road District," And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of February, 1864, the said Road District was altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last No. 156.—November 7, 1865.—1.

# MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE DUNOLLY RESERVOIR.

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, and no tents or huts shall be erected thereon.

2. The miners shall not sink any holes or make any excavation within three chains of the reservoir embankment or byewash.

3. All holes sunk or excavations made shall be properly filled up and rammed, to the satisfaction of the mining surveyor or other authorised officer, after having been worked out.

4. No gold washing shall be allowed within the area of the reservoir.

5. After a miner shall have marked out his claim, and before he shall have commenced to work, he shall deposit in the hands of the warden's clerk the sum of Two pounds sterling as a guarantee that he will observe and fulfil these conditions; and this sum shall be held by the warden's clerk until the miner who has made such deposit shall relinquish the claim held by him. If the conditions be fulfilled, then and in such case the whole sum shall be returned to the depositor; but if any if the conditions be not fulfilled, the whole of the said sum shall be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the reservoir shall be defrayed out of the moneys so deposited.
