THE SHIRE OF WARANGA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act* 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of June, 1863, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Waranga Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of February, 1864, the said Road District was altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last

general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Waranga Road District to be a Shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WARANGA.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE DUNOLLY RESERVOIR.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the holders of miners' rights to carry on mining operations within the limits of the Public Reservoir, Dunolly, on the following conditions, viz. :-

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, and no tents or huts shall be erected thereon.

2. The miners shall not sink any holes or make any excavation within three chains of the reservoir embankment or byewash.

3. All holes sunk or excavations made shall be properly filled up and rammed, to the satisfaction of the mining surveyor or other authorised officer, after having been worked out.

4. No gold washing shall be allowed within the area of the reservoir.

5. After a miner shall have marked out his claim, and before he shall have commenced to work, he shall deposit in the hands of the warden's clerk the sum of Two pounds sterling as a guarantee that he will observe and fulfil these conditions; and this sum shall be held by the warden's clerk until the miner who has made such deposit shall relinquish the claim held by him. If the conditions be fulfilled, then and in such case the whole sum shall be returned to the depositor; but if any of the conditions be not fulfilled, the whole of the said sum shall be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the reservoir shall be defrayed out of the moneys so deposited.

6. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or within such lands.

1. In other cases, the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

2. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Inspector of Stores, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Store Department, and for Works and Buildings: from these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. Orders must receive prompt execution, and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 4, or the head of department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

9. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in condition 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Government may direct.
