## COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole

or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase and proclaim (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

**HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.**—The Town Common of Horsham, described in a Proclamation bearing date 10th November, 1863, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the land hereinafter described: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 3, parish of Horsham; bounded thence by a line bearing north seventy chains, being the west boundary of a portion of the existing common; thence by a line bearing west two hundred and forty chains; thence by a line bearing south seventy chains; thence by the north boundary of section 1 and part of section 2, bearing east one hundred and thirty-six chains to the west boundary of the Horsham Cemetery reserve; thence by that reserve bearing north five chains fifty links, east ten chains, and south five chains fifty links; thence again by part of section 2 and by section 3, bearing east ninety-four chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian. Excluding from the area above described the Horsham Pound reserve. Area of land available for extension of common, 1572½ acres.—(65.G.8782.)

**WICKLIFFE TOWN COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown Lands within the boundaries hereinafter defined shall be and constitute the Town Common of Wickliffe: Commencing on the right bank of the River Hopkins at the point thereon where it is intersected by the north-eastern side of the road from Dunkeld to Streatham; bounded thence by that road bearing north-westerly to the west boundary of the township of Wickliffe; thence by that boundary bearing north to the north-west angle of the said township; thence by the north boundary thereof bearing east to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the east boundary thereof bearing south to a point thereon bearing east from the north-east angle of the Cemetery reserve; thence west to the River Hopkins aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement. As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, about 840 acres.—(65.L.12692.)
