PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common: when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under the *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the areas hereinafter mentioned to be respectively a Gold Field Common and a Farmers' Common, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

EURAMBEEN GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The allotments hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 7068 acres 3 roods 16 perches, shall be a common, under the designation of the Eurambeen Gold Field Common, viz.:—Parish of Eurambeen, allotments 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10; parish of Trawalla, allotments 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 57, 58, and 59.

EURAMBEEN FARMERS' COMMON.—The allotments hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 5148 acres 2 roods 12 perches, shall be a Farmers' Common under the designation of the Eurambeen Farmers' Common, viz.:—Parish of Eurambeen, allotments 3, 4, and 5; parish of Trawalla, allotments 56, 60, 69 B, 70, 71, 72, and 73.

CHILD MURDER.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about Noon of Friday, the 3rd of November instant, the body of a fully developed Female Child was found floating in the Yarra, near the Botanical Garden bridge, wrapped in a piece of white twilled calico and a dark crimean shirt, with a piece of cord tied round the neck so as to cause the flesh under the cord to be black: And whereas, at an inquest held on the deceased, a verdict has been returned of Wilful Murder against some persons or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as shall lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of causing the death of the said child.

Tenderers are to specify the kind of coal tendered for delivery by them, also the kind or kinds of wood, and the proportions of each kind. Printed forms of tender, may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne; the Chief Harbor Master, Williamstown; and the Police Magistrate at Geelong; by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit receipt, cash deposit, or sureties; if the latter, the certificate on the printed form of tender must be signed by two responsible persons willing to become bound in the sum specified for the due fulfilment of the contract; and the names of the tenderers and their proposed sureties, together with their respective addresses, must be stated at full length upon such certificate.

Tenderers must be accompanied by a bank draft or other tangible money deposit for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the

event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The Government may elect to require a cash deposit; but any approved security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised; or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender Box at the Stores and Transport Office, King street; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS.

1. The house coal is to be the best of its kind, free from shale, small coal, dust, or other impurities. The smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. The water is to be fresh and pure. The firewood (box, she-oak, red or white gum) is to be dry and of good burning quality.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and should an order be not complied with within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account the extra expense, if any, over and above the contract price. Supplies are to be delivered in quantities from one to twenty tons at a time on board steam dredges, wherever the same may be employed; and on board steam tugs at any wharf or hulk selected by the contractor in Hobson's Bay, the Yarra River, or Geelong, as the case may be.

3. The contractor for coal will be bound to furnish scales and weights, and to weigh the coal on delivery. The contractor for firewood will be bound to supply the wood in billets cut into two-foot lengths, and to place the same in suitable stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out; each stack to be only two feet wide, leaving a space between each stack.

4. As soon as the order for the coal or wood shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form, with the order attached thereto, to the department supplied. For water, the account is to be rendered monthly for the quantity supplied during the previous month. Accounts will be payable at the Treasury, Melbourne or Geelong, as the contractor may require.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ST. ARNAUD SHIRE FARMERS' COMMON.

ALL persons entitled to commonage under the Land Act of 1862 and the Amended Land Act of 1865 will be allowed to depasture their stock thereon, on payment of the following fees, subject to the undermentioned regulations:—

2. The fees for horses or mules shall be 10s. per head per annum; for horned cattle, 6s. ditto; for sheep, 1d. each per week; for progeny of horned cattle under 6 months old, 2s. for six months; progeny of horses, free; pigs, where allowed by the managers, will be charged 6s. per head per annum.

3. Travellers depasturing stock on the common shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, but shall be liable to pay 6d. per head for horned cattle and 1d. per head for sheep for every day beyond that time; but the managers shall always have power to prevent travelling stock remaining on the common for a longer period than twenty-four hours.

4. All fees shall be paid in advance, by the half-year or year, to terminate on the 31st March and 30th September, in each and every year. The yearly or half-yearly periods herein set forth shall not be divisible in respect to the payment of license fees.

5. The amount of remuneration to be paid by the managers to the herdsman employed by them, and for office fees and clerical assistance, shall not exceed 85 per cent. of the gross proceeds of the revenue of the said common. All surplus fees or balance of amount to be paid to treasurer of the shire on the first day of each month.

6. All holders of stock on the common shall muster them at a time and place appointed by the herdsman (of which due notice shall be given), for the purpose of branding the same with the brand of the common, should the herdsman require such to be done.

7. All stock on which the fees are not paid within ten days after time when due, or which have not been mustered at the time and place appointed by the herdsman, must be impounded by him at once.

8. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any stock which may be depastured on the common.

9. The number of stock depastured by any person on the common may be limited at any time, by a resolution of the managers; they must at the same time allow such person fourteen days from the time of notice being given, either by advertisement or otherwise, to remove the stock.

10. All entire horses, bulls, or bull calves, over six months old, found running on the common without the consent of the managers, shall be impounded by the herdsman.

11. All trespass fees shall be paid into the general revenue of the common.

12. All dead carcasses found on the common, the owners of which refuse or neglect to remove the same after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, the managers shall have power to authorise such removal, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owners.

13. When any animal is infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common, on receiving twelve hours' notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not be again put on the common without special permission of the managers; and, whether such animal was infected with disease at the time or subsequent to its being licensed to depasture, so soon as it shall be discovered to be infected, it shall in all respects be treated as if it had not been licensed.

14. The managers to meet at least once a month, to transact any business that may come before them.
