ADDITIONAL REGULATION RESPECTING APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES FOR THE OCCUPATION OF SITES.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1862*, and in the 70th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, the Governor in Council, on the 20th day of November, 1865, made the subjoined Regulation, viz:—

Applicants for licenses for the occupation of sites for rural inns, rural stores, manufactories, smithies, quarries, and brick-fields shall be required to deposit with their applications the sum of One pound (£1), to be returnable if the application be not granted, or to be retained as part of the first quarter's license fee if the application be granted, or to be retained as forfeited if after notification of the granting of the application the applicant shall fail or decline to take out the license, or shall allow a period of one month from the date of such notification to elapse without taking out the license.

ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Act intituled *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said colony with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time to define the limits and boundaries of the Ports in the said colony, and to frame rules for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and of pilots, and from time to time to alter,

amen), or repeal such rules, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Governor of the said colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, did define the limits and boundaries of certain ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and regulations previously in force: Now I Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the following shall be added to the rules and regulations contained in the Proclamation above referred to, viz.:-

The master of any ship within the meaning of *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865*, or any person under his command, shall not permit any steam machinery to be used on any public wharf for hoisting cargo into or out of such ship, or for any other purpose in connection with such ship, unless the owner of such steam machinery shall be the holder of an uncancelled certificate from the Chief Harbor Master, that such machinery is in good order, and that the person in charge thereof is duly qualified; and such master or other person shall, while such machinery is being so used, keep possession of such certificate, and shall produce it on demand to the harbor or pier master in charge of the wharf, pier, or jetty.

Such certificates will be issued by the Chief Harbor Master upon the applicants producing evidence to his satisfaction of the facts to be stated in such certificates respectively.

THE VILLAGE OF BUANGOR.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a village under the designation prefixed thereto, that is to say:-

THE VILLAGE OF BUANGOR.—Three hundred and eighty-four acres, county of Ripon, parish of Buangor: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 5; bounded thence by a line bearing west to the western boundary of the said parish; thence by that boundary bearing north to the southern side of the Arrarat and Ballarat main road; thence by that road bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 1 aforesaid; and thence by the west boundary of that allotment, bearing S. 8° 23' W. twenty-eight chains forty links to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(65.L.7537.)

CUSTOMS NOTICE.

DUTIABLE GOODS.—PORT OF SWAN HILL.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Governor in Council, in accordance with the powers conferred upon His Excellency in Council by the 236th clause of *The Customs Act 1857*, 21 Vic. No. 13, has been pleased to approve of the following dutiable goods being imported into Victoria at the port of Swan Hill, on the River Murray, in the packages and quantities hereinafter specified, and that the same may be entered and cleared thereat from the bonding warehouses for home consumption instead of in the packages and quantities at

present allowed by the Regulations of the Customs Department, viz.:-

Spirits in cask—in quantity as imported.

Spirits in bottle—in quantity of not less than six gallons.

Opium—in original packages.

Tobacco and cigars—if in original packages of not less than forty pounds weight.

And further, that any quantity of the following dutiable goods not less than that specified after each article, except any balance of such goods remaining in bond, may be entered and cleared from the warehouses for home consumption at the said port of Swan Hill, viz.:-

Beer in casks—two hogsheads.

Beer in bottle—ninety-six gallons.

Coffee—three hundredweight.

Rice—twenty hundredweight.

Tea—one chest, or packages equal thereto.

Wine in bottle—ten gallons.

Wine in wood—as imported.

And that all other goods liable to duty in quantities of not less than the entire parcel originally warehoused, if the duty thereon shall not amount to One pound, and if the duty on such parcel or parcels amounts to or exceeds One pound, then in not less quantity than would be chargeable with duty amounting to One pound.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—RABBIT ISLAND AND CORNER INLET.

Masters of vessels bound to Corner Inlet, or navigating in the neighborhood of Port Albert, seeking shelter under Rabbit Island, are requested to note the following alterations in the depth of water, &c., from that shown on the Admiralty chart of Corner Inlet by Commander Stokes, R.N., 1842, sheet No. 1703:-

1st. The depth of water over the anchorage ground for a mile N.W. of Rabbit Island to close in shore, except off the S.W. end of the island, has decreased from four, five, and six fathoms, the depth shown on the chart, to two, three, and three and a quarter fathoms, rendering this anchorage unsafe for any but very light-draft vessels.

2nd. There are several sandy patches with not more than two and a half fathoms over them on Stokes' fairway three fathoms line (Cape Wellington open of Rabbit Island). These patches commence about two miles N. by E. from Rabbit Island, and are found as you proceed to the northward here and there in the fairway over a space of a mile.

3rd. There are also several two and two and a half fathoms sandy patches on the leading line running N.W. and S.E. from Cliff Island to the entrance. These patches lie close to and around where the words "Corner Inlet" are printed on the chart, Mount Hunter W. by N. six miles.

4th. A two and a half fathoms navigable channel into Corner Inlet, not shown on the chart, has been found between Rabbit Island and Entrance Point. This channel runs parallel with the coast about half a mile off shore, directions for which will be published when the channel is buoyed off.

5th. There is also a deep but narrow channel from sea into Corner Inlet, having a depth of not less than four and a quarter fathoms. This channel is not shown in the chart, and is too intricate for any vessel to navigate without a pilot; Mount Hunter bears from its seaward entrance W. seven miles, Port Albert lighthouse N. 4 E. five and a half miles.

In consequence of these various alterations the two outer red cone buoys will be removed altogether on the fifteenth of next month.

All bearings are magnetic, and depths at low water spring tides.
