The mortality in Collingwood is unusually high. Among adults billous diarrbon and, low fever are most prevalent. In North Melbourne diarrhon and scarlatina are the most fatal causes of death. In Richmond dysentery and diarrhon are reported as in the ascendant.

It is evident that with the advance of summer the progress of disease is advancing with unusual celerity, and that more than ordinary caution will be necessary on the part of numleigal authorities and of private families to guard against the destructive results consequent upon the neglect of the plainest rules of hygiene.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statut to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation is such city, town, district, or place; Now thorefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
- 8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
- 9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
- 10. Any person who shall act in contravention of either of the foregoing regulations shall upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
