# PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the licensing of Public-houses and the Sale of Fernmented and Spirituous Liquors, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality) a district or place within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district or place special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant) as specified in the 7th clause of the said Act, viz, that the licensee shall be authorised to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the Shire of Avoca to be a district within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district Special Temporary Licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions hereinbefore specified.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act, 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, after, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act, 1862, and the now-reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, increase the common therein after mentioned, that is to say:—

The Burgarce Farmers' Common described in a Proclamation

The Bungarce Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th of March, 1861, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of 6000 acres, more or less, county of Grant, parish of Bungaree, being the unsold and unappropriated lands in allotments 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of section 19, and in sections 31, 33, 34, 36, 37, 38, and 39.—(65.K.1888.)

#### WORKS ON MAIN ROADS ORDERED UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1868."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by The Local Government Act, 1863, has, by Orders severally made on the 3rd day of April, 1865, directed that the undermentioned District Boards of Road Districts shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, in accordance with sufficient plans deposited by the said District Boards respectively, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The District Board of the Bacchus Marsh and Maddingley Road District shall, within twelve months from the 3rd day of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one hundred and eighteen and a half chains on the Main Melbourne to Ballarat road.

The District Board of the Eltham Road District shall, within twelve months from the 3rd day of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about ninety-four chains and ninety-two links, and form and drain about sixty chains, on the Main road extending through the said Road District from the Lower Plenty Bridge to the Very Elliet. to the Yarra Flats.
