WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *The Post Office Statute, 1861*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and alter regulations for the establishment and management of Post Offices, and the receipt, despatch, carriage, and delivery of letters, packets, and newspapers: And whereas much inconvenience and delay to correspondence are caused by newspapers and packets being posted in the town-letter receiving-boxes: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that newspapers and packets posted in the town-letter receiving-boxes having the words "For Letters only" painted thereon, shall be treated as irregularly posted newspapers and packets, and shall not be transmitted or delivered.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

INTERCOLONIAL MONEY ORDERS BETWEEN TASMANIA AND VICTORIA.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the third day of April, 1865.

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *The Post Office Statute, 1861*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to make arrangements with the proper authorities of any British possession for the issue and payment, by means of the Post Office, of

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money orders between Victoria and the said possession, and for the accounting for and transmission of moneys connected therewith; also to make and alter regulations relating to money orders, and to the persons by or through whom, and the places where and the times when, and the manner and form in which money orders shall be issued, and to the persons in favor of whom, and the places where and the times when, and the manner and form in which money orders shall be paid, and to the length of time during which they shall be current, and after which they shall become void; and to the mode of forwarding messages or advices of transmitting moneys, and of managing credits, accounts, and other matters and things necessary to be forwarded, transmitted, or managed in reference to money orders; and relating to every other matter or thing necessary to be regulated or done for perfecting a system whereby the public may be enabled promptly and safely to remit small sums of money through the Post Office:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that, on and after the first day of May now next ensuing, money orders may and shall be issued at all post offices in the colony of Victoria to which the money order system is now or may hereafter be extended on such post offices in Tasmania as the Government of that colony shall from time to time notify as post offices at which such money orders can be made payable.

That on and after the date above mentioned, all money orders drawn in Tasmania, by postmasters and others duly authorised in that behalf, on the post offices in Victoria at which money order business is transacted, shall be payable under the money order regulations in force.

That the amount of premium to be charged on all money orders issued in the colony of Victoria on Tasmania, shall be as follows:—

For any sum not exceeding £5	One shilling
Ditto above £5 and not exceeding £10	Two shillings

That the largest amount for which any money order shall be issued in Victoria on Tasmania, shall be (£10) Ten pounds.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., FROM MOUNT TARRENGOWER PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone, or gravel from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the portion of Crown lands hereinafter named and described, including Mount Tarrengower, in the parish of Maldon, county of Talbot, viz.: Commencing at a point bearing east one chain

from the north-east angle of allotment 7 of section 1 A; thence by the road forming the east boundaries of allotments 6 and 5 of the said section, bearing northerly to its junction with the main road from Maryborough to Maldon; thence by that road, bearing north-easterly and south-easterly, to its junction with the road forming the west boundaries of suburban allotments 31, 30, and 1 of section 1; thence by that road, the west boundary of the township of Maldon, and a line bearing south, to a point due east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing west; excluding all sold and otherwise appropriated land.—(65.K.2292.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF FITZ-ROY GARDEN, FLAGSTAFF HILL, AND ALBERT PARK RESERVES.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act, 1865*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of the public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, have made the following Regulations, to be observed and enforced in respect of the following public parks and gardens, viz., Fitz Roy Garden, Flagstaff Hill, and Albert Park.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons entering any of the before-mentioned parks and reserves after sunset shall confine themselves to the roads or paths therein.
2. Entrance into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes in any of the parks and reserves is prohibited.
3. No person will be allowed to bring into any of the parks and reserves any dog, unless the same be duly registered and led by a chain or cord, and wearing a collar engraved as required by the *Dog Act*.
4. Children under ten years of age will only be admitted into any of the parks and reserves when accompanied by and in charge of adult persons.
5. Persons whilst smoking will not be allowed to be on the grass in any of the parks and reserves.
6. The following acts are strictly forbidden—

Throwing stones or other missiles.
Breaking or depositing glass bottles on the surface of the ground within any of the parks and reserves.
Plucking or cutting branches of trees, damaging shrubs, trees, or plants, taking flowers or grass without authority, lighting fires, and interfering with birds or fish in any of the parks and reserves.

All persons are hereby cautioned that, under the provisions of the 67th section of the Act before mentioned, every person offending against such rule or regulation shall on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and that every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such rule or regulation, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
