THE accompanying Notices, which have been received from the Consul-General for the Netherlands, respecting certain Beacons on the coast of Java, are published for general information.

THE Director of Means and Domains notifies to mariners that a red-painted Herbert's beacon buoy has been placed in 22 feet of water in the bight of Samarang, having the following bearings:—

Korowelan, S. 16° W. distance 14 German miles.
Mount Oenarang, across the middle, S. 31° E.

THE Director of Means and Domains notifies to mariners that the coast light on the fourth point of Java, in the Straits of Sunda, near Anjer, will be temporarily extinguished on the 5th August, 1865, in order to transport the lantern and lighting apparatus from the old to the new lighthouse at aforesaid place.

In the meantime it is hereby notified that the new lighthouse has been erected in the immediate neighborhood of the old one; that the light will be probably rekindled one month after the extinguishing of it; that it will be erected at an elevation of 46 Netherlands yards above the level of the sea and visible at a distance of 5 German geographical miles.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish certain commons as hereinafter mentioned, and do proclaim other commons in lieu of such abolished commons, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

BOWMAN'S FOREST GOLD FIELD COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 5th January, 1864, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Bowman's Forest Gold Field Common, viz.:—Commencing at a point where the surveyed main road, three chains wide, from Beechworth to Myrtleford crosses the Burgooise Creek; thence by the said road bearing south-easterly to a point on the summit of a range, distant about a quarter of a mile in a south-easterly direction from the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 9; thence by the summit of the said range, bearing easterly, north-easterly, and north-westerly to a point due east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing west. Area available for commonage, 2600 acres, more or less; exclusive of all sold and otherwise legally appropriated lands.—(65.K.876.)

CROWLANDS TOWN COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th February, 1861, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the undermentioned land shall be and constitute the Crowlands Town Common, viz.:—All the unsold and unappropriated land in the township of Crowlands, and the area hereafter described, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of the said township; thence by a line bearing west fifteen chains, more or less, to a wire fence; thence by that fence bearing north-westerly to the River Wimmera; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to its intersection by the west boundary of the before-mentioned township; thence by that boundary south to the point of commencement. Total area available for commonage, about 680 acres.—(64.L.8393.)

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., IN OR FROM THE TOWNSHIP OF WARRINGAL PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the portion of Crown lands hereinafter named and described, viz. the township of Warringal, parish of Keelbundora, county of Bourke, described in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th of February, 1861; exclusive of all sold and otherwise appropriated land therein.—(65.K.3280.)

INCORPORATION OF THE CRESWICK DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of April, 1865.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Creswick District Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Creswick District Hospital, situate in the borough of Creswick, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Creswick District Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
