## BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the common hereinafter mentioned, and do proclaim another common in lieu thereof, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 13th May, 1861, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Bowman's Forest Farmers' Common, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the Ovens River, bearing south from the south-west angle of allotment 8 of section 7 parish of Murrumbidgee; thence by a line, the west boundaries of allotments 8, 5, 4, and part of the west boundary of allotment 1, all of section 7, and again by a line bearing north to the summit of a range; thence by the summit of the said range bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 2; thence by a line bearing east to the said angle of that allotment; thence south by the west boundary of that allotment to the Burgooise Creek; thence by that creek bearing easterly to its junction with Stony Creek; thence by Stony Creek bearing south-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 7 of section 3; thence by part of the east boundary of that allotment bearing north to the centre of Burgooise Creek aforesaid; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the surveyed main road, three chains wide, from Beechworth to Myrtleford; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to a point on the summit of a range, about a quarter of a mile distant in a south-easterly direction from the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 9; thence by the summit of the said range bearing south-westerly and westerly to a point bearing thirty chains in an easterly direction from the north-east angle of allotment 10 of section 10; thence by a line bearing S. 13° W. to the Ovens River; thence by that river bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage, 9300 acres, more or less; exclusive of all sold and otherwise legally appropriated lands.—(65.1631.)

## RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE UNITED YANGARDOOK KOROROH AND DJERREWARREH, ETC., FARMERS' COMMON.

Passed at a Meeting of the Melton District Road Board, 28th April, 1865.

ANY person holding or occupying purchased land within five miles of the boundary of this common will be entitled to its advantages.

2. That each person entitled to commonage shall be permitted to graze one head of cattle for every two acres he may have under cultivation during the current year.

3. Cultivation shall mean and be understood as ploughed land for crop, ploughed land for fallow, or self-sown crop intended to be harvested.

4. That all cattle sent to said common shall have the owner or owners' brand (in legible and distinct characters or letters) on them, in order that the herdsman may be able to discover any strange cattle that may be at any time upon said common. Parties removing their cattle will intimate the same to the herdsman by notice in writing.

5. All persons applying for a license to depasture their cattle will be required to fill up a form, to be obtained from either of the managers or herdsman, setting forth the number of acres he has under cultivation according to the intent and meaning of these regulations, and also make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

6. Any person found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license for, the managers will have the power to cancel his license, and prevent him the use of the common during that year.

7. The fees for all cattle (horses excepted) will be five shillings per head per annum, and for horses seven shillings per head, payable in each case half-yearly in advance; all cattle under six months old free.

8. That the year shall commence on the 6th day of October, 1863, and end on the 5th day of October, 1864, and no less fees will be charged during the currency of said year.

9. That in no case will sheep be permitted to graze on said common during the first year, at the end of which time, if the then licensed commoners (or a majority of them) agree to depasture sheep, this rule will be altered or amended to suit their wishes.

10. In no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without the written consent of all the managers.

11. A record shall be kept by the herdsman describing the brands of all licensed cattle; same to be subject to the inspection of commoners, who are requested to assist in discovering unlicensed cattle on the said common, and to communicate the same to the herdsman, if possible.

12. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound any sheep or cattle found trespassing on said common, an entry of which he will make in a book kept for that purpose, so that damages and fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

13. That all cattle suspected to be diseased, the owners shall (by order of the managers), after twelve hours' notice in writing, remove the same off said common; and in the event of refusal, the owner shall be considered a trespasser, and be liable to the penalty inflicted or recoverable under and by virtue of the 129th clause of the Land Act, now in force in the colony of Victoria. And that the same cattle shall not be returned to the said common without the consent in writing of the managers first had and obtained.

14. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all the cattle under his care once every twenty-four hours. Should any be missing during that time he is to inform or notice the owners thereof the day following, and make an entry in his book to that effect. Failing to do so will subject him in each case to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, and One shilling per day until the beast is found.

15. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages, and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner, in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured; and each license granted will be under the condition that he can be sued for the same, and the amount to be recoverable before any justice of the peace.

16. The herdsman must be accountable to the commoners for any loss sustained by having their cattle impounded, if strayed off the common, the amount in each case not to exceed the impounding expenses; and the herdsman shall receive as an equivalent 6d. per head from the managers, for all cattle found trespassing on said common.

17. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or discharge him without notice, and he can have no claim upon them for compensation whatever.

18. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

19. All diseased cattle found trespassing will be immediately destroyed.

20. Special licenses will be granted in exceptional cases, when considered necessary.
