## LENGTH OF VOYAGE OF STEAM VESSELS CARRYING PASSENGERS FROM VICTORIA TO SYDNEY, NEWCASTLE, ADELAIDE, AND HOBART TOWN.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a Proclamation under the hand of the Acting-Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, was issued under the authority of *The Passengers Act 1863*, whereby amongst other things the length of the voyage for the purposes of the said Act of any steam vessel carrying passengers from Victoria to certain ports in New South Wales, and Tasmania, and to South Australia, was declared as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as is hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that so much of the said Proclamation as prescribes what shall be deemed for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage from any port or place in Victoria to Sydney or Newcastle, New South Wales; Hobart Town, Tasmania; and South Australia, of any steam vessel carrying passengers, viz.:—Twelve days for any auxiliary screw propelling vessel, ten days for any screw steam vessel, and eight days for any paddle-wheel steam vessel, shall from and after the fifth day of May instant, cease and be revoked.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute, 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application of the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Jamieson has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the

proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Jamieson to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE BOROUGH OF WOOD'S POINT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the first day of May, 1865.

### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as hereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" hereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been presented to the Governor by inhabitant householders resident at Wood's Point, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of March in the present year: And whereas no petition in opposition to the first-mentioned petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exer-

cise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE BOROUGH OF WOOD'S POINT.**—Commencing at a point one mile due north (true meridian) from the centre of the Wood's Point bridge over the left branch near its junction with the right branch on the Goulburn River; thence east eighty chains; thence south one hundred and sixty chains; thence west one hundred and sixty chains; thence north one hundred and sixty chains; thence again east eighty chains to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF TARNAGULLA.

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the first day of May, 1865.*

**WHEREAS** by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the tenth day of April in the present year, it is ordered that a county court shall be holden at Tarnagulla, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Tarnagulla, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Tarnagulla shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Tarnagulla on or before Wednesday, the tenth day of May instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sunday, the twenty-first and twenty-eighth days respectively of the same month of May; the court of petty sessions at Tarnagulla aforesaid shall revise such list on Wednesday, the seventh day of June next ensuing; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Friday, the ninth day of June aforesaid; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the twenty-sixth day of the same month of June.

And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

1. All officers, non-commissioned officers, and other persons serving for pay in the Volunteer Force, or in the Military Store Department will be designated as belonging to the Local Staff.

The following officers are appointed to the Local Staff with the rank opposite to their names:—

## AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st MARCH, 1885.—APPROXIMATE RETURNS.

\* The collector for South Bourke has not sent in his returns. An estimate has therefore been made for that portion of the county based upon the figures of previous years. The collector for Murrumbidgee has only supplied particulars respecting the agriculture in his district; the figures relating to the number of holdings, the land in occupation and the land enclosed, have therefore been taken from last year's returns. The collector for Cripps Land has not furnished his returns, the figures given are therefore those of last year. The remaining returns have been taken from the collectors' summaries, which have only been partially checked. It is not apprehended however that, when finally revised, the totals will differ materially from those now given.

The mean temperature of March, 1865, was lower, and the mortality higher than they were during the same month of any of the five previous years. The daily average of deaths, however (12.04), was less than it was in February (13.79).

Males died in the proportion of 54 per cent.; females in that of 46 per cent., to the whole mortality. Deaths of children under five years of age amounted to 59 per cent. of the total, against 58 per cent. in March, 1864, 57 per cent. in March, 1863, 58 per cent. in March, 1862, 65 per cent. in March, 1861, and 61 per cent. in March, 1860.

Seventeen deaths occurred respectively on the 2nd, 6th, 29th, and 31st. These were the days of highest mortality. The day of lowest mortality was the 21st, on which the occurrence of only six deaths was reported.

A male, aged 34, died during the month of brain disease; another male, aged 76, of disease of the heart; also a female, aged 80, of cancer. These were the oldest persons whose deaths were reported.

Twelve deaths from violence occurred during the month. Four of these were from drowning, viz., those of a laborer, aged 60, of a bookseller, aged 43, of a fireman, aged 26, and of a female, aged 14, all in the River Yarra; the latter supposed to have been self-inflicted. A female, aged 28, and a child, aged 2, died of burns; a goldminer, aged 55, of a compound fracture of the leg; a carter, aged 35, of an accidental fall; an accountant, aged 36, and a goldminer, aged 28, of poisoning; the latter suicidal. A child, aged 7, was accidentally suffocated in a cesspool; a general dealer, aged 28, was murdered by stabbing.

Sixty-three deaths, or nearly 17 per cent. of the mortality, occurred in public institutions, as follow:—Melbourne Hospital 35; Lying-in Hospital, 7; Immigrants' Home, 6; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7; Industrial Schools, 3; St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 1; Melbourne Gaol, 1.

Deaths from zymotic diseases in March were rather more numerous in proportion to the total mortality than they were in February, the per-centage being 40 against 38. This was partially caused by deaths from scarlatina having increased from 4 to 17, and those from typhus and infantile fever from 8 to 12. The increase in the mortality from zymotic affections would, however, have been greater had not deaths from diarrhoea fallen off from 73 to 60. Under the head "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis caused 32 deaths against 35 in February.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the nineteenth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

#### EXTENDED BLOCK CLAIMS.

1. *Extent of claims.*—The extent of claims shall be as follows:—

Depth of sinking.	Length of claim.
Not exceeding one hundred (100) feet	Sixty (60) feet
Exceeding one hundred (100) feet and not exceeding two hundred (200) feet	Seventy (70) feet
