LENGTH OF VOYAGE OF STEAM VESSELS CARRY-ING PASSENGERS FROM VICTORIA TO SYDNEY, NEWCASTLE, ADELAIDE, AND HOBART TOWN.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIE CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS a Proclamation under the hand of the Acting-Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, was issued under the authority of The Passengers Act 1865, whereby amongst other thines the length of the voyage for the purposes of the said Act of any steam vessel carrying passengers from Victoria to certain ports in New South Wales, and Tasmania, and to South Australia, was declared as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as is hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that so much of the said Proclamation as prescribes what shall be deemed for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage from any port or place in Victoria to Sydney or Newcastle, New South Wales; Hobart Town, Tasmania; and South Australia, of any steam vessel carrying passengers, viz.—Twelve days for any auxiliary screw propelling vessel, ten days for any screw steam vessel, and eight days for any paddle-wheel steam vessel, shall from and after-the fifth day of May instant, cease and be revoked. cease and be revoked.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer liceose shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the reming, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application of the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Jamieson has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the No. 40.—MAY 5, 1865.—1. WHEREAS by The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863, it is a mongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geolong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next thereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as thereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" thereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for regulating Juries, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereimbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the teath day of April in the present year, it is ordered that a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Tarnagulla, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The collector for Gipps Land has not furnished his returns, the figures given are therefore those of last year. The remaining returns have been taken from the collectors' summaries, which have only been partially cheeked. It is not apprehended however that, when finally revised, the totals will differ materially from those now given.

The mean temperature of March, 1865, was lower, and the mortality higher than they were during the same month of any of the five previous years. The daily average of deaths, however (1204), was less than it was in February (1379).

Males died in the proportion of 54 per cent.; females in that of 46 per cent. to the whole mortality. Deaths of children under five years of age amounted to 59 per cent. of the total, against 58 per cent. in March, 1864, 57 per cent. in March, 1862, 65 per cent. in March, 1861, and 61 per cent. in March, 1869.

Seventeen deaths occurred respectively on the 2nd, 6th, 29th, and 31st. These were the days of highest mortality. The day of lowest mortality was the 21st, on which the occurrence of only six deaths was reported.

A male, aged 84, died during the month of brain disease; another mule, aged 76, of disease of the heart; also a female, aged 80, of cancer. These were the oldest persons whose deaths were reported.

Twelve deaths from violence occurred during the month. Four of these were from drowning, viz., those of a laborer, aged 60, of a bookseller, aged 43, of a fireman, aged 26, and of a female, aged 14, all in the River Yarra; the latter supposed to have been self-inflicted. A female, aged 28, and a child, aged 2, died of burns; a goldminer, aged 55, of a compound fracture of the leg; a carter, aged 35, of an accidental fall; an accountant, aged 36, and a goluminer, aged 28, of poisoning; the latter suicidal. A child, aged 7, was accidentally suffocated in a cesspool; a general dealer, aged 28, was murdered by stabbing.

Sixty-three deaths, or nearly 17 per cent. of the mortality, occurred in public institutions, as follow:—Melbourne Hospital 35; Lying-in Hospital, 7; Immigrants' Home, 6; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7; Industrial Schools, 3, 8t. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 1; Melbourne Gaol, 1.

Deaths from zymotic diseases in March were rather more numerous in proportion to the total mortality than they were in February, the per-centage being 40 against 38. This was partially caused by deaths from scarlatina having increased from 4 to 17, and those from typhus and infantile fever from 8 to 12. The increase in the mortality from zymotic affections would, however, have been greater had not deaths from diarrhoea fallen off from 73 to 60. Under the head "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis caused 32 deaths against 35 in February.
