By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field for, as the case may be] Common of "for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED GOLD FIELDS COMMON OF LINTON'S, BROWN'S, SPRINGDALLAII, HAPPY VALLEY, LUCKY WOMAN'S, AND ITALIAN GULLY, comprising the Gold Field Common of Linton's, Brown's, Springdallah, Happy Valley, and Lucky Woman's, (described in a Proclamation bearing date the first day of June, 1863), and the Gold Field Common for Italian Gully (described in a Proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of March, 1861). And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned commons.—(64.1)165.)

By His Excellency Sire Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHERAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore 1, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter, abolish, or proclaim (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

DUNOLLY TOWN (Now BOROUGH) COMMON.—The area and

DUNCLLY TOWN (NOW BOROUGH) COMMON.—The area and boundaries of the Dunclly Town Common, as described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January, 1861, are hereby altered, and the common shall henceforth be designated the "Borough Common of Dunclly," and shall comprise an

area with the following boundaries, viz.:—Fourteen thousand three hundred and sixty acres, more or less: Commencing at a point on the range which divides the waters of Burnt Creek from those of Murphy's Creek, bearing N. 41° E. from the north angle of the Dunolly borough boundary; thence south-casterly by that watershed and the watershed between Burnt Creek and Jones's Creek to a point where it intersees the east side of the Dunolly and Tarnagula road; thence by a straight line south-easterly about one hundred and twelve chains to the north-east angle of the Dunolly Gold Field Common; thence by the north boundary of that common west to the north-east boundary of the borough of Dunolly; by that boundary south-easterly to the east angle of the borough; thence by the south-east boundary, thereof, bearing south-westerly, to the north-west angle of the Dunolly Gold Field Common; by the west boundary of that common south to its south-west angle; thence by a line bearing approximately N. 55° W. one hundred and thirty chains, more or less, to the point of intersection of the Dunolly and Redbank road with the watershed between Burnt Creek and the Carmanuel Creek; thence north-westerly and northerly by that watershed and the watershed between the Burnt Creek and the Avoca River to a point thereon, bearing west one hundred and five chains; and N. 46° W. one hundred chains from the west angle of the borough of Dunolly; thence cast one hundred and five chains; thence S. 46° E. one hundred chains from the west angle of the said borough; thence by the north-west boundary of said borough and a line bearing N. 4° E. one hundred chains the declaration of the proportical land, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64.J.10111.)

AMENDED FORM OF GOLD MINING LEASE UNDER THE ACT 25 VICTORIA No. 148.

W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, No. 148, initiuled, An Act to amend the Law retaring to Leases of Auriferous Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Courcil from time to time to make regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, prescribing the form of leases under the said Act, and the covenants and conditions to be inserted in such leases, and such regulations from time to time to alter, amend, or rescind: And, whereas by Order in Council made on the 13th day of October, 1862, certain regulations were made relating to leases under the said Act, and the form thereof, and the covenants and conditions to be inserted therein: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said form: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that all gold mining leases issued pursuant to the provisions of the said Act shall be in the form heroto annoxed, instead of in the form of schedule G annexed to the Regulations of the 13th October, 1862, above referred to, that is to say:—

therein, for such rent or sum as the case may be, and the costs and expenses of such distress and otherwise incurred by the non-payment of the said rent or sum, and the distress and distresses then and there found to dispose of in due course of law, as landlords may do in respect of distresses for rent reserved upon leases, and to apply the produce of such distress and distresses in or towards payment of the said rent or claim and of the costs and expenses of such distress and otherwise incurred by the non-payment of the said rent or sum; this provise, however, to be without prejudice to any other right of distress for the said rent which may be enforced by or on behalf of Her Majesty, her heirs, successors, or assigns; Provided also, and it is hereby expre-sly declared and agreed that if the said lessee, he accurate administrators, or assigns, shall at any time during the continuance of this demise refuse or neglect to observe or perform all or any of the conditions, covenants, and provises hereinbefore on h part contained or referred to, then and in such case the said term hereby granted shall, at the will of the said (Sovernor, expressed in writing under his hand and seal, cease, determine, and be void, snything herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding: And that, in every such last-mentioned case, it shall be lawful for Hor Majesty, her heirs, successors, or assigns, or her or their agents or officers, without any previous demand whatsoever, to enter forthwith into and upon the said demised premises, and the same to repossess and enjoy as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed, and the said lessee, and all persons claiming under h for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any legal process whatsoever, and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty, her heirs, successors, or assigns, had obtained in different and increased in the said lessee, and all persons claiming under h for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any
