WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:-

At Mornington, once at least in every four calendar months.  
And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute* 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Raywood has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Raywood to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act* 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of October, 1860, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Amherst and Clunes Road District;" and the boundaries of the said road district were altered by another Proclamation bearing date the third day of March, 1862: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Amherst and Clunes Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE SOUTH SUBDIVISION**—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Beckworth; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Beckworth and Clunes to the eastern boundary of the Amherst and Clunes Road District; thence by the boundaries of the said road district southerly, westerly, and northerly to the commencing point; excepting the municipality of Clunes.

**THE EAST SUBDIVISION**—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Eglinton; thence northerly by the west boundary of the parishes of Eglinton and Craigie to the northern boundary of the Amherst and Clunes Road District; thence by the boundaries of the said road district easterly, southerly, and westerly to the intersection of the northern boundary of the parish of Clunes; thence by the northern boundary of the parishes of Clunes and Beckworth westerly to the commencing point.

**THE WEST SUBDIVISION**—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Eglinton; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parishes of Eglinton and Craigie to the northern boundary of the Amherst and Clunes Road District; thence by the boundaries of the said road district westerly, southerly, and easterly to the north-west angle of the parish of Beckworth; thence by the northern boundary of the said parish easterly to the commencing point; excepting the municipalities of Amherst and Talbot.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act* 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the seventh day of May, 1860, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Franklin and Yandoit Road District;" and the boundaries of the said road district as at present existing are defined in another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of December, 1863: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Franklin and Yandoit Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE CENTRAL SUBDIVISION**—Commencing at a point one chain east of the south-east angle of portion 6 of section 8 of the parish of Wombat; and thence by a line bearing north along the west boundaries of portions 4 and 3 of section 7 of the said parish; thence northwards to the south side of block 19 in the parish of Holcombe; thence westerly along the south boundary of the said block 19 to the centre line of the Middleton's Creek; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to a point west of the south-western angle of allotment 11, parish of Holcombe; thence west crossing Mount Franklin and along southern boundaries of sections 6 and 7, parish of Franklin, to the western boundary of said parish; thence by the west boundary of said parish of Franklin continued south to the centre line of the Glengower or McLachlan's Creek; thence southwards by the centre line of the said creek and by the eastern boundary of the Creswick Road District to a point sixty-four chains below the north-west angle of the Corinella Station; thence by a line bearing east to the western boundary of the borough of Daylesford; thence north and east by the west and north boundary of the said borough to the commencing point aforesaid.

*Cotton Shirts*: Narrow red and white stripes.
