PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Raywood has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the provise of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Raywood to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.
