THE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be made of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The *Blankets* are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 84 lbs. per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 34 inches in width. *Serge Shirts*: Brownish-grey and yellow check. *Cotton Shirts*: Narrow red and white stripes.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF AVOCA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: And whereas it is expedient to extend the said Act to the undermentioned shire: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the Shire of Avoca.

WOOD'S POINT GAOL.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 219), intituled, *An Act to consolidate the Law relating to Gaols*, it is amongst other things enacted that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols"), respectively, of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the premises hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the Police Lock-up situate at Wood's Point is a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1864" EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF KEW.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 225), called *The Police Offences Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place,

and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

SPECIAL TEMPORARY LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF LIQUORS IN THE SHIRE OF ARARAT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the licensing of Public-houses and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality) a district or place within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district or place special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant) as specified in the 7th clause of the said Act, viz., that the licensee shall be authorised to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the Shire of Ararat to be a district within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district Special Temporary Licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions hereinbefore specified.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER ETC., FROM RESERVED LAND IN THE PARISH OF DUNEED PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone, or gravel from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber, or bark, or stone, or gravel from the portion of Crown lands hereinafter named and described, viz.: the portions of allotments M, N, and O, in the parish of Duneed, which have been temporarily set apart as a Recreation Reserve by Order in Council of 1st May, 1865.

POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling places or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrates acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts, and it is expedient to revoke the appointment of one other polling place: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places mentioned in the Schedule herunto annexed to be polling places for the divisions opposite to the names of which they are respectively placed; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby revoke the appointment of the Confines of Woodend as a polling place for the Tylden division of the district of Dalhousie, that is to say:—

EXPEDITION ISLAND, OFF CAMDEN HARBOR.

THE subjoined Notification and Report, received from the Government of Western Australia, are published for general information.

His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following notice of the recent discovery of a low sandy island off the north-west coast of Australia, by Captain John T. Jarman, of the barquette *Tien Tsin*.

Fremantle, 20th April, 1865.

SIR,—I have the honor to report to you the existence of an island not laid down on the Admiralty Chart, sheet, No. V., of N.W. Australia, surveys of Capt. King and Stokes, 1842, or on a general chart of Australia, dated 1864; the nearest danger on

the charts being the Beagle Banks, distance some eighteen miles to the north-westward. The following is an extract from my journal:—

February 15th, 1865.—Daylight, moderate breeze from W.S.W., vessel steering E. & S., fine clear weather. At 7h. 20m. a.m., the look-out from aloft reported land to N.N.-Eastward; hauled the vessel up direct for it, until had shoaled the water from forty fathoms to five fathoms, over a rocky bottom, the west end of the land then bearing due north, and distant five miles.

It proved to be an island, low and sandy, somewhat elevated towards its centre, which portion was apparently doited with stunted bushes. It is six miles in length, trending nearly east and west, with an apparent breadth of not more than two or three miles.

The island is now about fifty feet in height, giving it a probable elevation of about thirty feet at high water. Shallow water extends three to four miles southward of it, and many scattered patches of rock are now visible, extending a considerable distance from both the east and west ends. Some doubtless cover at high water.

As we ran along the edge of the shoal water on a due east course, obtained three sets of sights for longitude, thirty minutes' interval of time between each set, the distance run carefully noted by log and bearings of the land. By these observations I make the centre of the island to be in latitude (from Sun's meridian altitude) 15° 33' 35" south, and longitude 123° 45' 45" east, assuming Arthur's Head, W.A., to be in 115° 45' east.

My chronometers I found to be keeping excellent time, by many subsequent observations at Camden Harbor and Tien-Tsin Bay.

This danger is in the direct track of vessels coming from the westward toward the new settlement at Camden Harbor.

Sighted Cockell's Island at noon, Champagne Isles at 1 p.m., and anchored at 7 p.m. abreast of Point Hall.

I have named this discovery "Expedition Island," in consideration of our present employment in service of the West Australian Government. March 21st, 1865, on my return passage, I passed, at 11 a.m., close to the island, and verified the above position. Same day, at 4 p.m., made Adele Island.

SHIRE OF KORONG.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

THE ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on every fourth Thursday throughout the year; at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, or on such other day as the council may from time to time appoint.

2. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to read and confirm the minutes of the previous meeting, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon except as to the accuracy of such minutes as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting.

3. The order of the proceedings at each meeting shall be as follows:—

1. Reading and ordering on correspondence, petitions, and memorials.

2. Reading reports of committees and officers.

3. Orders of the day; comprising all business not completed at any former meeting; business of which due notice has been given; and any matter which the president shall think fit to introduce.

4. Instructions to officers.

5. Examination of accounts for payment.

6. Notice of motions to be considered at future meetings.

7. All notices of motion must be given to the secretary, in writing, and be signed by the proposer, and shall be read aloud at the meeting at which they are given. No motion of which notice has been given shall be considered unless the councillor who gave such notice, or some other councillor, duly authorised by him in writing, shall be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

8. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall be a member of such committee.

9. Any councillor speaking on any matter before the council, or asking any question, must rise and address the president or the chairman for the time being; and the president or chairman must also rise when addressing the council. No councillor shall be interrupted except by a call to order, when he shall sit down until the question of order be decided. The president or chairman shall put each question, first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and shall then and there decide which has the majority of votes.

10. The ruling of the president, or of the chairman of each meeting, shall be final on all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing a precedent. If two or more members rise at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is first entitled to be heard.

11. Every motion, together with the names of the mover and seconder thereof, shall be entered on the minutes, and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded if required by any councillor.

12. No motion or amendment shall be entertained until it has been seconded, and every motion or amendment shall be put in an affirmative form. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, and if lost another may be moved before the original question is put by the chairman; but if any amendment be carried it shall take the place of the original motion, and one amendment may be moved thereon, but no more. No motion or amendment once before the council shall be withdrawn without leave.

13. Any question may be set aside by the motion, "That the council do now adjourn," or by the previous question being moved, viz.: "That that question be now put," but on neither of these motions shall any discussion be allowed.

14. Any councillor may protest respectfully against any resolution of the council at the time of such resolution being adopted, and such protest shall, at the request of the councillor making it, and with the consent of the council, be entered in the minute book.

15. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president to withdraw such expression and apologise for the same, shall refuse or neglect to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

16. All tenders for contracts shall be addressed to the president, and shall only be opened at the time of their consideration. Each tender shall be accompanied by a deposit of Five pounds which shall be returned to the tenderer in the event of his tender not being accepted. The names of the parties tendering and the amount of each tender shall in every case be entered on the minute book. On the acceptance of any tender the person tendering shall pay into the hands of the treasurer a deposit of Five pounds per cent. on the amount of the tender exclusive of the deposit accompanying the tender, which amount shall be returned to the contractor on the production by him to the treasurer of a certificate from the engineer that the works under the contract are satisfactorily completed.

17. All accounts must, before payment, have been passed by the council, and no payment shall be made by the treasurer on any contract unless the engineer's certificate for the amount be produced by the contractor.

18. The engineer shall attend at each ordinary meeting of the council, and furnish a report of the condition and progress of the works throughout the shire. The rate collector shall furnish to the council, at each ordinary meeting, a report shewing the amount of rates collected since the last meeting, the moneys paid to the treasurer, and the amount of rates remaining uncollected; and all other officers of the council shall furnish official reports at each ordinary meeting.

19. Any bye-law may be suspended, for a special purpose, with the consent of the whole of the councillors present at any meeting.

The above bye-law is published in accordance with the 174th section of the Local Government Act, and was passed by a special order of the council, at a meeting held at the Shire Office, at Wedderburn, on the 11th May, 1865.
