For comparing measures of extension, including stamping when necessary—

For each yard and under	2d.
For each additional yard	1d.

For examining and comparing balances, beams, steelyards, and other weighing machines, including stamping when necessary—

For each balance, &c., not capable of weighing above 56lb.	6d.
For each balance, &c., capable of weighing above 56lb., and not above 112lb.	9d.
For each balance, &c., capable of weighing above 112lb., and not above 10 cwt., or fractional part thereof, for each cwt.	9d.
And for every additional cwt. beyond 10 cwt.	6d.
