## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRES OF NEWSTEAD AND YACKANDANDAH.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Newstead.  
The Shire of Yackandandah.

## SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

BYE-LAW No. —TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL AND OFFICE BRARERS.

THE business of the council at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the council, the first business thereof shall be the reading of, and putting for confirmation, the minutes of any preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be allowed thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president, or in his absence by the chairman of the meeting.

3. The order of the business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable.—

1. Reading correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day.

5. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under consideration; any councillor may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary, at the meeting previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

6. A notice of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, where the council consider it necessary to do, there not being more than one councillor absent at such council meeting, and the meeting unanimous.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him, be present when the business is called on; and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

8. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

9. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

10. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but, if lost one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the council.

14. No councillor shall speak more than once on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply on an original motion of which he may have been the mover or as the mover of an amendment last proposed, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

15. Every councillor when proposing a motion or amendment or speaking on any matter shall address the president and shall not be interrupted except called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided; the councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

16. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who if required by the president shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

17. Any councillor may with the consent of the president require the secretary to take down the particular words used by any councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

18. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council, on giving notice of his intention to do so on the adoption of a resolution, and on such councillor entering his protest and his reason for the same in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council; provided always that such protest may be expunged if decided by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth or not to be in terms respectful to the council.

19. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper inviting applications for the same, nor unless the salary or allowances attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

20. All contracts shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the

president, and only be opened at the time of their consideration by the council. The respective amounts, with the names of the parties tendering, shall in every case be entered on the minutes of the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the person tendering, or someone on his behalf, shall pay a deposit, in accordance with a rule hereafter mentioned, into the hands of the treasurer.

21. All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by the president and one other councillor, and countersigned by the treasurer, or such other person as the council may appoint; and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which its payment shall have been recommended by the finance committee, and passed at a meeting of the council.

22. The security in all cases of contract shall be 10 per cent. on the amount of the contract, to be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer of the shire, which amount shall be repaid to the contractor when he obtains his final certificate that the works under his contract have been satisfactorily completed.

23. The Shire Office shall be opened every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m., during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall attend during the hours of business at every meeting of the council.

24. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, with the unanimous consent of the council, there not being more than one councillor absent.

The foregoing bye-law was made by special order on the 11th day of May, 1865, and was confirmed on the 15th day of June, 1865.

## UNION UNDER "THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, may proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Amherst and the Road Board of the Districts of Amherst and Clunes have requested that the said borough and road district may be proclaimed a "union," and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of one-half by the Borough of Amherst and one-half by the Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the Borough of Amherst and the Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the Council of the said Borough of Amherst and Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes:—One-half by the Council of the Borough of Amherst, and One-half by the Road Board of the Districts of Amherst and Clunes.

The mortality in May has been much above the average, and has not been equalled in any month since January 1863. The weather also was colder than usual, the mean readings of the thermometer being two degrees below the average.

Of the deaths which took place 53 per cent. were of males, 42 per cent. of females. The mortality of children under 5 amounted to 56 per cent. of the whole, against 53 per cent. in May, 1864; 52 per cent. in May, 1863; 54 per cent. in May, 1862; 53 per cent. in May, 1861; and 56 per cent. in May, 1860.

The large number of twenty-nine deaths occurred on the 10th, nineteen of which were of children under 5. The next highest daily mortality was twenty, which occurred on the 5th and 17th. The days of lowest mortality were the 22nd, 26th, and 27th, on which respectively only four, six, and five deaths occurred.

A male aged 75 died of cancer; a male aged 75, another aged 85, and a female aged 87, died of old age. These were the oldest persons whose deaths were reported.

Twenty-four deaths from external causes took place during the month. Of these, seven were from drowning, viz., those of a master mariner aged 45, a saddler aged 33, a male aged 30, a boy aged 34, and another boy aged 3, accidentally; a male aged 30 and a female aged 20, suicidally. An engineer aged 18 died of scalds caused by the accidental bursting of a boiler; a boy aged 5, a boy aged 13, and a girl aged 1, also died of scalds. A female aged 18, of burns. A ferryman aged 60 died of a fall from a dog-cart, a carter aged 23, and a female aged 43 of injuries to the spine, a female aged 48 of dislocation of the shoulder, a female aged 40 of injuries caused by being run over, and a girl aged 5 by falling from a tree. An infant of 6 months, and another of 2 months old,

were accidentally suffocated. A sailor aged 35 committed suicide by cutting his throat, and a male aged 34 by poisoning himself. A prostitute aged 21 was murdered by having her throat cut. A laborer aged 45 was judicially hanged.

Eighty-one deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole number, took place in public institutions. Of these, thirty-nine occurred in the Melbourne Hospital, eight in the Benevolent Asylum, six in the Lying-in Hospital, nine in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, two in the Royal Park Asylum, six in the Immigrants' Home, eight in the Industrial Schools, one in the Melbourne Gaol, one in the Penitentiary Stockade, and one in the hulk *Success*.

Of the 225 children dying under five years of age, 129, or nearly 57 per cent., were males, and 96, or about 43 per cent., were females; 123 were under one year of age, 53 were between one and two years, 23 were between two and three, 16 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died beyond the age of five years numbered 180; of these 108, or 60 per cent., were males, and 72, or 40 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 13 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 5 were between fifty and fifty-five, 6 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were seventy-five and upwards.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to further amend the Laws relating to the Customs*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint the ports which shall be warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, and the other Acts with which the said Act is incorporated: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Port of Echuca, on the River Murray, to be a Free Warehousing Port.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
