REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF GOODS UNDER BOND FROM MELBOURNE TO WAREHOUSING PORTS ON THE RIVER MURRAY.

FROM and after the 1st day of July, 1865, bonded goods may be exported under bond from the port of Melbourne to warehousing ports belonging to New South Wales, situated on the Murray, by rail *via* Echuca, and from thence by steamer or other approved means of conveyance to the port of destination.

2. Goods in bond at the port of Melbourne may, in the same manner, be removed under bond to Echuca, or to other warehousing ports belonging to Victoria on the River Murray.

3. Similar goods may be removed to another on the River Murray, from one warehousing port to another on the River Murray, under the usual regulations.

4. No drawback will be allowed on duty paid goods, entered outwards, for ports belonging to New South Wales on the River Murray.

5. In the event of steamers or other approved means of conveyance not being in waiting at Echuca to receive goods entered out for other Murray ports, on their arrival by rail at that station, the owners or agents of such goods will be required to place the same in bond (*in transitu*) at that port until a vessel or other approved means of conveyance is ready to convey them to their destination, when they are placed in such vessel or other means of conveyance, by and at the expense of the owner or agent thereof, under the supervision of the officers of this department.

6. No goods forwarded under bond for Murray ports shall be allowed to remain, during *transitu*, at the railway station, Echuca, for more than 24 hours after arrival; goods not shipped from thence to their destination, or placed by the agents or owners thereof in the bonding warehouse at that port, within the time specified, will be removed to bond by the officers of this department, at the expense of the parties interested, and shall remain in such bond at their risk until all expenses attending such removal and warehousing have been paid.

7. The bond to be entered into at the port of removal or export must cover goods to their port of final destination; it will be unnecessary therefore, for owners or agents of goods detained at Echuca, under the circumstances referred to in preceding paragraph, to enter into a further bond at that port.

8. The bonds entered into for the removal or export of goods to Murray ports shall contain a covenant, binding the exporters of such goods, and their sureties, to produce, within a reasonable time, to be stated therein, to the collector of the port of export, a certificate from the proper officer of customs at the port of destination of such goods, acknowledging the receipt thereof.

9. On an entry being passed for removal or export of goods from the warehouse, Melbourne, for Murray ports, *via* Echuca, such goods shall be forwarded by, and at the expense of, the owner, under the usual regulations, to the searcher of this department, at the railway station, Melbourne, who will duly record the receipt and transmission of such goods, and properly secure the carriages conveying the same.

10. A *transire*, in duplicate, containing particulars of goods forwarded under bond by rail, signed by the searcher of customs, at the railway station, and countersigned by the railway officer, shall be transmitted by the train conveying the goods, under cover, to the principal officer of customs, Echuca, along with shipping bill; and the duplicate of the former will be returned by the searcher to the collector, Melbourne, along with the customs entry of goods, duly certified to by such searcher as having been exported or removed.

11. On the arrival of goods under bond, by rail, at Echuca, the declaration on the *transire* accompanying the same is to be signed by the guard, or other railway officer, in presence of the principal officer of customs; and, should the goods be intended for that port, such *transire* is to be treated as a coastwise report, and entries are to be passed accordingly.

12. If the goods are entered out and intended for ports in New South Wales, or for other Victorian ports on the Murray, the *transire* is to be retained by the principal officer of customs, Echuca, who will intimate to the collector, Melbourne, the arrival at his station of the goods *in transitu*.

13. In a like manner the officer of this department at the port of destination, when the goods are intended for Victorian ports, shall acquaint the collector with their arrival at his station.

14. The principal officer of customs at Echuca is particularly directed to take care that all bonded goods forwarded to that port *in transitu* for other ports on the Murray, shall be entered and borne on the vessel's manifest conveying the same to their final port of destination.

15. Dutiable goods, the produce of New South Wales, may be entered and bonded at Victorian ports on the Murray, to be either cleared for home consumption, or removed, under bond, by rail, *via* Echuca, to the port of Melbourne, under similar regulations as bonded goods removed or exported therefrom for Murray ports.

16. The master of every vessel trading to and conveying bonded goods from Victorian ports on the Murray, shall be required to enter into bond, by himself and two sufficient sureties, to conform to the customs laws and regulations of this colony, and shall, in every case where goods are removed by him from one warehousing port to another, be a party to the removal or export bond entered into by the owner or agent of such goods.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 26th day of June, 1865, directed that the undermentioned Shire Council and District Boards shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Kyneton shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile and sixty chains of the Main Kyneton to Heathcote road.

The Council of the Shire of Kyneton shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about sixty chains of the Main Kyneton to Blue Mountains road.

The District Board of the Fryers Road District shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile seventy-five chains and thirty-five links of the Main Road through their district.

The District Board of the Melton Road District shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about four miles of the Main Melbourne to Ballarat road.

The District Board of the Pylong Road District shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about twenty-seven chains and thirty-seven links on the Main Heathcote road.

The District Board of the Strathfieldsaye Road District shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about five miles twenty-eight chains and thirty-five links of the Sandhurst to Heathcote Main road.

The District Board of the Upper Yarra Road District shall, within twelve months from the 26th of June aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile sixty-seven chains and eighty-eight links of the Main Road known as "The White Horse road," through their district.

The Governor in Council has, by Order made on the 26th of June, 1865, revoked a previous Order of 8th May, 1865, (gazetted on the 19th of May, page 1136, *ante*.) directing the Council of the Shire of Lexton to drain, form, and metal about forty-six chains and seventy-seven links of the Main Ballarat to Avoca road between the Springs and Lexton.

SCHEDULE B.

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff, it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides, set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½-inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private residences lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining streets shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
