WHERBAS by The Electoral Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shallsee fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the North-Western Province and the police magistrates acting in the localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of the said province: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the places mentioned in the second column of the Schedule hereunto annexed, to be polling places for the divisions named opposite to the same respectively for taking the poll in and for such respective divisions at contested elections for the North-Western Province, and doth hereby revoke the appoi

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—TO REGULATE BY STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS AND AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF AVOCA.

SHIRE OF AVOCA.

1. The business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, and shall be open to the public; but any two councillors present may require the exclusion of strangers, until it shall have been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be brought forward shall be discussed publicly or otherwise.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on the first Thursday in each month, commencing at Eleven o'clock a.m., the business to commence as soon as the legal/quorum is present; but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the councillors present, in the minute-book; and such meeting shall accordingly be adjourned.

Any memorial or petition addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received, until notice of motion shall have been given with reference to the subject of such petition in the manner required by section 10; or such memorial or petition may, by resolution, be referred to a committee to report upon.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received pro forma, and, if ordered by the council, printed for distribution among the councilists, to be considered at any subsequent meeting. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the council be taken separately on each.

8. All reports sent in to the council by any councillor or committees thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheek of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left, so that the sheets can be properly bound together.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out.

committees thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left, so that the sheets can be properly bound together.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any unimportant business, not requiring a formal notice of motion, which the president, or any councillor, or the secretary, may bring forward, and in the ordering of which a verbal instruction to the secretary or other officer may be deemed sufficient.

10. Any councillor may introduce any business in the form of a notice of motion; and every such notice shall be in writing, signed by the mover, who shall endorse thereon the day upon which he intends to submit it for consideration; and every such notice shall be read aloud by the mover at the meeting previous to that at which such notice is to be considered by the council, and shall then be given to the secretary, to be entered in the minute-book, and all notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given. 12. Every motion or amendment shall be in writing, and shall be signed by the mover and seconder; and, on the division thereon, if any, the votes shall be recorded, and the names of the councillors voting pro and con. entered in the minutes of the original manuscript of any motion or amendm

13. Points of order.—1st. Every councillor, including the prosident, shall stand while addressing the council. 2nd. The decisions of the president shall be final on all questions of order or practice; and he shall state the same without comment or argument. 3rd. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, nor make personal reflections. 4th. Any councillor who shall use an expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor shall, if required by the president, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council. 5th. The president shall call to order anyone out of order (whether he be a councillor or ratepayer); and if the president shall order him by name to leave the room; and if he still persist in his interruptions, the president shall order him by name to leave the room; and if he still persist in his interruptions, the president shall order him by name to leave the promise of the still persist in his interruptions, the president shall order him by name to shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted except by a call to order, when he shall be silent until the councillor calling to order shall be heard, and the question of order decided, when the councillor in possession of the chair shall proceed with the subject.

17. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply to any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

18. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but all amendments shall be discussed and put before the original motion; and no councillor shall move more than one amendment on the same question.

19. The president shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as may be necessary to enable him to decide which is in the majority. The council shall in all cases vote by show of hands; and all questions before the council; shall be decided by open voting.

20. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion for adjournment he negatived, the subject them tinder consideration, if any, or if none, then the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, before any subequent motion for adjournment be entertained.

21. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council such amendment shall be lield to have quashed the original motion.

THE copies of the standard weights and measures shall be entrusted to the custody of the shire inspector for the time being, who shall give security to the council for the proper use and safe custody of the same, as also the due payment of all moneys received by him, and the surrender of the said weights, measures, and all other things the property of the corporation, when he may be required to do so.

The inspector shall attend at the Shire Office on the first and third Monday in every month, from Ten o'clock in the foremont till Three o'clock in the afternoon, unless such day shall be appointed a public holiday, or that he may of necessity be absent, when he shall attend at the earliest possible date; a notice

The inspector shall on or before the third day of each month make a return to the treasurer of the shire of all moneys received by him during the past month, showing the several particulars for which the same were received, the number of prosecutions under the Act, and how the same were disposed of. He shall also keep a diary of the whole of the transactions under this Act.
