## DUBLIN INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION.

(To be opened 10th May, 1865.)

The Board has been constituted to afford advice and information to intending exhibitors.

The Victoria collection must be ready to be shipped by the *Great Britain*, to sail on the 10th of March next. It is therefore necessary that those who propose to avail themselves of this mode of giving publicity to their undertakings should at once prepare the objects they mean to send, and deliver them at the Exhibition Building on or before the 1st of March, well packed in suitable cases.

The funds at the disposal of the Board are very limited. The chief assistance which they can offer must be in the form of advice, founded on the experience derived from former undertakings of a similar kind. They will, however, forward to Dublin, free of cost, all such manufactures and products delivered to them at Melbourne as may be considered to possess sufficient merit to be worthy of a place in the Exhibition.

The Board having no executive agency in Dublin, will take charge of such articles only as are intended for permanent exhibition there, or as may be consigned to the friends or agents of the exhibitors.

The Board will not undertake to return goods to Victoria, but will, as far as is in their power, carry out the views of the exhibitors as to the ultimate disposal of them.

## REGULATION.

In cases where the Collectors of Customs are satisfied that a refund of duties is justly due, the necessity for such refunds arising either from overpayment of duty or from any error, the repayment may be granted.

This regulation, however, shall not apply to any drawback, refund, or omission authorised by the Customs Act, 1857, nor sanction any refund or remission disallowed by the Customs Act, 1857.

In order to facilitate refunds, the Collectors of Customs (through the Commissioner of Trade and Customs) may obtain from the Governor a quarterly authority under the 32nd clause of the Regulations respecting public accounts, dated 1st May, 1859, instead of a special authority as required by the 35th clause of the regulations.

This regulation shall have force from 1st January, 1865.

## DISTINGUISHING FLAGS AND PENNANTS OF ADMIRALS AND OTHER NAVAL OFFICERS.

## (DISTINGUISHING FLAGS AND PENNANTS.)

WITH reference to chapter 4, section II., article I., of the Queen's Regulations as to the Classification and Rank of Flag Officers, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Her Order in Council (9th July, 1864), to direct that the classification of the officers in question, under the denomination of the Red, White, and Blue Squadrons, shall be discontinued; and that the following regulations shall be henceforward established in regard to "Distinguishing Flags and Colors."

### Chap. 2, sect. IX., "Distinguishing Flags."

Articles 4, 5, and 6.—Admirals, Vice-Admirals, and Rear-Admirals shall, in future, wear respectively a white flag with the red St. George's cross therein, at the main, fore, or mizentop-gallant masthead.

Article 7.—In boats and tenders with less than three masts, Vice-Admiral's flags shall be distinguished by one red ball in the upper part of the flag, near the staff, and Rear-Admiral's by two such balls.

### Sect. X., "Distinguishing Pennants."

Article 1.—Commodores of the 1st class shall wear a white broad pendant with a red St. George's cross therein, at the maintop-gallant masthead.

Article 2.—Commodores of the 2nd class, a similar broad pendant at the foretop-gallant masthead.

When two or more of Her Majesty's ships are present in ports or roadsteads, a small broad pendant (white, with a St. George's cross) is to be hoisted at the mizentop-gallant masthead of the ship of the Senior Officer.

Article 1.—When more than one Commodore of the 1st class shall be present, the Junior Commodore shall wear such distinguishing mark or pendant as the Commander-in-Chief (or Senior Officer) may order, under the authority given by article 3, section IX., chapter 2.

Commodores of the 2nd class, when carrying their pendants in boats and tenders, shall be distinguished by a red ball in the upper part of the pendant next the mast.

Article 3.—The fly of the long pendant for Her Majesty's ships shall be, in future, white.

### Section XI., Colors—Navy.

Article 1.—All Her Majesty's ships of war in commission shall bear a white ensign, with a red St. George's cross and the union in the upper canton.

*Section XII, Colors—not Navy.*

*Article 2.*—Ships and vessels employed in the service of any public office shall carry the blue ensign and a small blue flag with the union described therein, as prescribed by the said article (2), blue being substituted for red where color is therein specified.

The blue ensign, and union jack with a white border, may be borne by ships and vessels commanded by Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve Force, and fulfilling in other respects the conditions required to entitle them to the privilege. (*Vide* circular No. 33, dated 3rd August, 1864.)

*Article 1.*—The red ensign, and union jack with a white border, are to continue (as prescribed by art. 1) the National Colors for all other British ships, with the exception of yachts and such other vessels as their lordships may from time to time authorise to bear distinguishing flags.

All regulations not conflicting with the foregoing remain in force.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now-reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council, made on the first day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill intitled *An Act to consolidate the Law relating to Trusts and Trustees*, reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the twentieth day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

#### INCORPORATION OF THE DUNOLLY DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of January, 1865.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Dunolly Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in manner following, that is to say:-

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Dunolly Hospital, situate in the borough of Dunolly, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Dunolly District Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### REGULATION.

*Fuel, Light, and Water, for Police.*

Fuel, light, and water, will be allowed to the police, according to the following scale, but where a less quantity will suffice, the issue shall be limited thereto:-

Fuel.—Officers of police throughout the colony will draw fuel under clause 48.

Sergeants and constables will receive, in winter (from the 1st May to the 30th September), six (6) cubic feet of wood per man per week; in summer (from 1st October to the 30th April), four (4) cubic feet per man per week, or an equivalent in coal according to value.

Married men in Melbourne who receive no fuel will, in lieu, be allowed six (6) shillings per month in winter, and four (4) shillings per month in summer.

Water.—Police officers, sergeants, and constables, will be allowed two gallons each per day.

Light.—Gas will be allowed where most economical; elsewhere kerosene oil for one lamp in officers' quarters, offices, and outside lock-ups, and inside barrack-rooms; also one forty-eight of a pound of sperm candles to each officer and man per night.

**CARLYLE PUBLIC CEMETERY.**

**R**ULES and Regulations made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established in the parish of Carlyle.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or when the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees in Rutherglen or Wahgunyah, before Five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from first September to thirtieth April; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other four months of the year.
6. Application for permission to build a vault, or erect a monument, must be made at the office of the trustees, when a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, must be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
12. No servant or other person employed by the trustees, or engaged in any duty on their behalf, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
13. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building-erection, railing-fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria, No. 12.
14. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.
16. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in this cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.

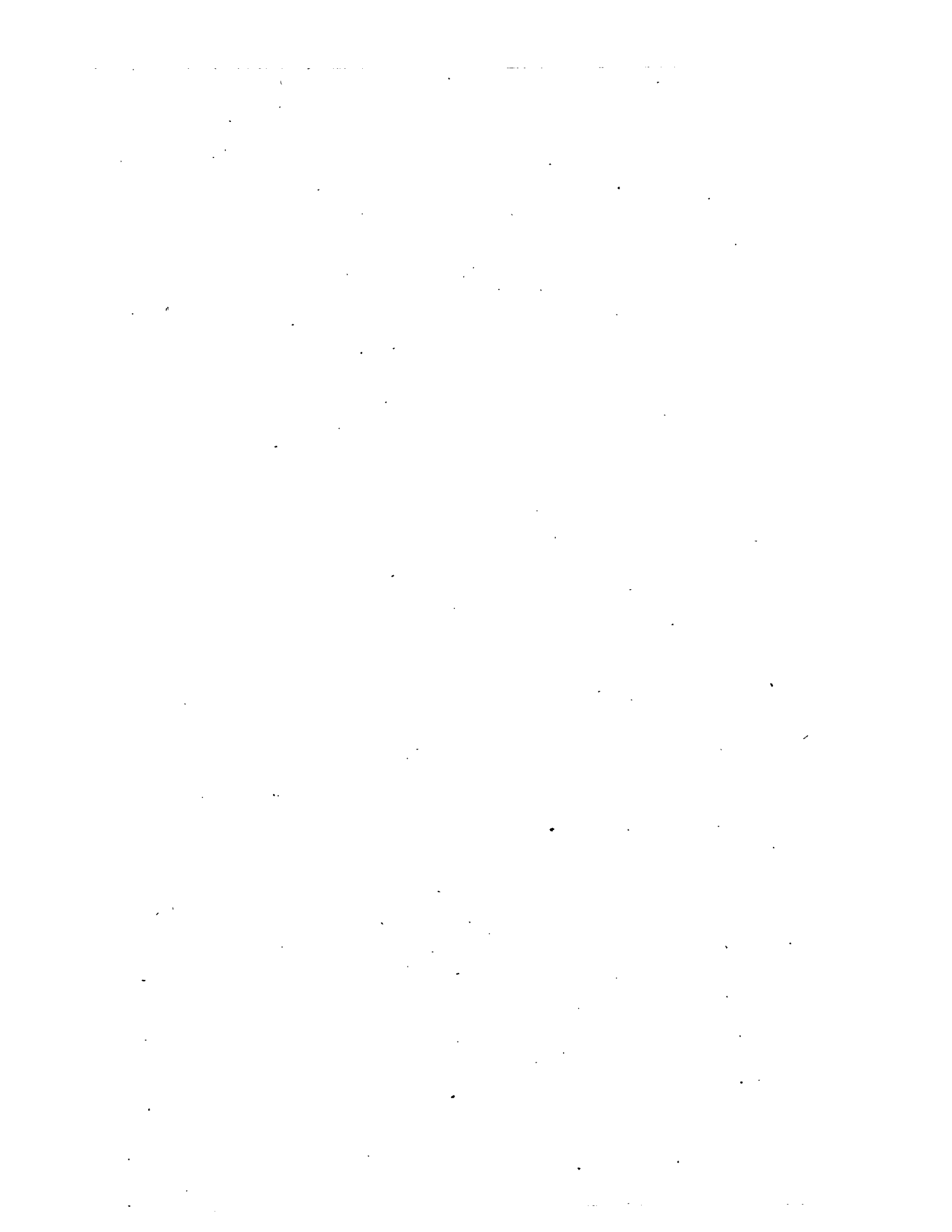

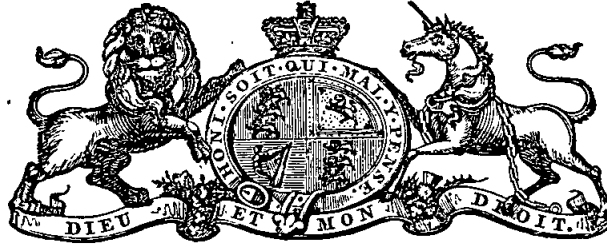
