## MARINE BOARD. Notice to Mariners.

CAPTAIN CELLEM, of the s.s. *Queen*, reports having grazed on a rock, hitherto unknown in the channel, between the East Cape Island and the main.

The following is an extract from his report:—"The rock is about one cable's length west from the middle of the island, and had 12 feet water on it. I grazed the same at One a.m. on the 25th May, in the s.s. *Queen*, on her last passage from Auckland."

Captain Cellem's report, and also that of the master of the s.s. *Beautiful Star*, which vessel recently struck on a rock north of the East Cape, tends to show that the whole locality is dangerous.

The Board, therefore, would caution masters of vessels against making use of the channel in question.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed  
in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her  
Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute*  
1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in  
Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend  
all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the  
said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and  
may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place,  
and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Pro-  
clamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so  
proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town,  
district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling,  
the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive  
Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions con-  
tained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I.  
of the said Statute to the Shire, Borough, and Road District  
hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst  
other things enacted that the Governor in Council may  
from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any  
common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-  
proclaimed, and may from time to time reclaim the whole  
or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and  
subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now  
recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling,  
the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council,  
do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in  
accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is  
to say:—

THE LINTON TOWN COMMON described in a Proclamation  
bearing date the 15th day of August, 1864, is hereby increased  
by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the  
town boundary of Linton.—(65K.5921.)

described, viz.—Three hundred acres, more or less, county of  
Polwarth, parishes of Birregurra and Yeo, being the unsold and  
unappropriated land in allotment K of section 22, and in allot-  
ments L and M of section 28, parish of Birregurra, allotment N  
of the last-named section, and allotment 1, in the parish of  
Yeo, to be a Town Common for all householders in the town of

Birregurra, in accordance with the above recited provisions of  
the said Act.

INCORPORATION OF THE UPPER GOULBURN  
DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of  
the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for*  
*Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things  
enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease,  
or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons,  
and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contribu-  
tions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have  
paid not less than one pound per annum or twenty pounds in  
one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned,  
and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed  
contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also  
enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on  
the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of  
the said persons praying that such institution may be incor-  
porated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be  
published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-peti-  
tion signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall  
have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within  
one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in  
Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such  
institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue  
a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the  
Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a  
common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has re-  
ceived a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contri-  
butors to the institution known as the Upper Goulburn District  
Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated:  
And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has  
been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-  
petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary  
within one month after the date of such publication: Now  
therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice  
of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare  
the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and  
corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in  
manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called  
and known as the Upper Goulburn District Hospital, situate  
in the borough of Wood's Point, are hereby declared to be a  
body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Upper  
Goulburn District Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief  
Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE GORRINN, LANGI-GHIRAN, AND CATHCART FARMERS' COMMON, AND OF THE WANDOL TEMPORARY COMMON, WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ARARAT.

EVERY person occupying purchased land, or land leased from the Crown otherwise than under *The Amending Land Act 1865*, within the same parish or same agricultural area as any of the abovenamed commons, also any holder of a miner's right, business license, publican's license, or special temporary license, resident upon or within the boundaries of any of the aforesaid commons, shall be entitled to depasture thereon such description of stock as may be decided by the managers of the respective commons.

2. Each person entitled to commonage, as in the preceding clause, shall be permitted to depasture cattle on the common to which he is so entitled according to the following scale, that is to say, one head of cattle for every four acres he occupies; the holder of a miner's right, one head of cattle or one horse; the holder of a business license, publican's license, or special temporary license, two head of cattle or two horses, or their equivalent in other stock, at the option of the managers.

3. The assessment on stock depasturing on each of the above commons to be as follows, viz.:

For every horse over twelve months old, Five shillings (5s.) per year.  
For every head of cattle over six months old, Three shillings (3s.) per year.  
For every sheep over six months old, Ninepence (9d.) per year.  
For every goat over six months old, One shilling (1s.) per year.

Such rates to be exclusive of the cost of management. The managers of each common for the ensuing year shall, on or before the fifteenth day in October in each year, submit an estimate of the expenses for management for that year, when the shire council will make such additional rates as will cover the cost of management.

4. The owners of stock depasturing on any of the aforesaid commons will be required to muster them in their own yards or some more convenient place, as often as may be found necessary, to be branded with the common brand in pitch, upon notice in writing being given them by the herdsman or managers. All stock to be branded by the herdsman or managers. All unbranded stock found on the common to be considered as straying, and to be impounded forthwith. Horses to be exempted from being branded.

5. Bulls or entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers.

6. The herdsman of the respective commons, or any person authorised by the managers, may have authority to impound all straying or unauthorised stock found thereon, a registry of which he will be required to keep so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.

7. It shall be necessary for the owners of any cattle diseased, or supposed to be diseased, to remove such cattle from the commons within twenty-four hours after notice in writing requiring them so to do has been given them from a majority of the managers by the herdsman or one of the managers; and in the event of the owner's refusal so to do, he shall be considered as a trespasser, and be liable to the penalties mentioned in clause 129 of *The Land Act 1862*. Any person being found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license and paid for, shall be liable to the penalties mentioned in clause 129 of *The Land Act 1862*.

8. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or negligent of his duties, they may remove or discharge him after one week's notice.

10. The managers are not to be held responsible for any neglect or irregularities of the herdsman.

11. A record to be kept by the managers or the herdsman showing the number and description of cattle each person has paid for.

12. The managers shall give a printed receipt to each man, showing the number and descriptions of stock, and the amount paid in respect of them.

13. Special licenses may be granted by the managers when considered necessary, and with the sanction of the council.

14. The managers to hand in to the secretary of the shire, on the first day in October in each year, the various books of account kept by them in respect of the commons, together with a statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past year, for the purpose of being audited by the auditors of the shire.

15. All assessments to be paid half-yearly in advance, the half years to commence on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year.

16. The shire council will appoint managers for the respective commons at its first meeting in October in each year, such managers not to enter upon office until the first day of November following, and to continue in office until the first day of November in the succeeding year. Should any manager vacate his office during the currency of any year, the council will appoint another in his stead, who shall continue in office so long only as the manager in whose stead he was appointed would have continued in office.

17. All monies received by the managers to be paid to the treasurer of the shire half-yearly within one month after collection of the same.

18. The managers shall furnish such security as the council may determine.
