NOTICE RESPECTING WRECKS, MARINE CASUALTIES, AND VESSELS IN DISTRESS.

AS it is desirable that the Government should receive the earliest intimation of wrecks, or marine casualties, or of the necessity for rendering assistance to vessels in distress, all Masters of Vessels and persons connected with Her Majesty's Customs, Police, Harbor and Telegraph Departments, and others who may be in possession of information in respect of such cases, are directed to avail themselves of the most accessible and speedy means of communication to place such information in the hands of the Chief Harbor Master, in order that he may, without any delay, take whatever steps the urgency of the case may demand.

The Police, the Chief Harbor Master, and all Officers of the Harbor and Customs Departments are to use every exertion with promptitude to render assistance where required, transmitting full particulars of the steps which they have taken, and recommendations as to any further assistance necessary, to the Chief Secretary and the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

RENEWAL OF LICENSES UNDER THE 42ND SECTION OF "THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865."

THE attention of holders of licenses under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, is particularly requested to the requirements set forth in the 16th clause of the regulations relating thereto (copy appended), as the penalties attached to a breach of this regulation will be strictly enforced.

16. *Renewal of licenses.*—If the holder of a license shall, within fourteen (14) days before the expiry of the term of such license, or of any license renewed as hereinbefore provided, notify to such receiver and paymaster, or other officer as hereinbefore mentioned, that he desires to renew his right of occupation under such license, and if he forward with such notification the amount payable thereunder, and if he adduce evidence (on being required so to do) sufficient to show that he has complied with the conditions of the license then in force, the license may be renewed subject to all the terms and conditions thereof, and the licensee shall not be required to erect posts, publish notices, or make application as hereinbefore directed. *If the holder of any such license fail to forward such notice and fee within the period before mentioned, he will, on the expiration of the term of the license, be liable to forfeit his right to occupy the land described in such license, and if he continue thereafter to occupy the land, he will be liable to prosecution for unauthorised occupation of Crown lands, and no compensation will be given for any improvements on the land, which will thereupon be deemed to be available for occupation by other persons, or to be otherwise appropriated.*

Forms of application for renewal of license can be obtained from the local receivers and paymasters, or other officers authorised to issue the licenses.

2. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery, to be made to the trustees; permission, in the form contained in schedule A, will be granted to applicants on payment of the proper charges.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of a poor person in the cemetery, on evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees that the deceased was without means, and that his relations or friends are unable to pay the charges.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but should a brick grave or vault be required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or of some other person appointed by them. No grave to be less than six feet deep.

5. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton, or other person appointed by the trustees, on the day preceding the interment, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Six o'clock p.m.; the particulars required in schedule B. must be stated when giving the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery.

7. The hours appointed for interment are from Eight o'clock a.m. until Six o'clock p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Eight o'clock a.m. until Four o'clock p.m. during the remaining months.

8. The plans of all monuments, tablets, and fences to be erected, must first be submitted to the trustees for approval.

9. Monuments, tablets, and fences, are to be kept in proper condition and repair at the expense of the owners, or they may be removed by order of the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented.

11. If an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the written consent of the owner must be left with the order.

12. A plan of the cemetery and register will kept.

13. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

14. All persons injuring the cemetery, or its fences or monuments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

15. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

The foregoing Rules and Regulations were agreed to by us at a meeting of trustees held at Oxley on the 28th day of June, 1866.

4. That the said his heirs and near relations, shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or enter therein except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.
