PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of Ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and also in like manner to alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations from time to time, and to substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Governor of Victoria, with

the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Ports, Harbors, and Shipping in the Colony of Victoria*, did define the limits and boundaries of certain ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and regulations previously in force: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal the fifty-seventh clause of the rules and regulations above referred to, and do declare that the following shall be substituted therefor:—

57. In the event of any goods which may be landed or placed for shipment on any of the public wharfs being allowed to remain on such wharf more than twenty-four hours, notice will be served on the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods, and if the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods cannot be ascertained or found, a notice will be posted upon or affixed to some conspicuous part of such goods, and if they are not removed within three days from the date of such notice, the goods will be taken by the officer discharging the duties of wharfinger to the Customs Reserve, or some other place duly appointed for that purpose, and there dealt with according to the 43rd section of *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*.

FISHING WITH NETS IN LAKE BURRUMBEET AND ITS TRIBUTARIES PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, dated the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, were extended to Lake Burrumbeet and its tributaries, for three years, the provisions of the eleventh clause of the *Act to amend and consolidate the Laws for the Protection of the Fisheries of Victoria*, which enacted that if any person should set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra-yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater Rivers, in the colony of Victoria, or in any or either of their respective tributaries, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, should by Proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the above-recited clause, he should forfeit such net, and also such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, as the convicting justice should think fit: And whereas the period specified in the aforesaid Proclamation has expired, and it is expedient that the setting, laying down, using, or fishing with any kind of net in the waters named should again be prohibited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the

Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the provisions of the eleventh clause of *The Fisheries and Game Statute 1864* to Lake Burrumbeet and its tributaries.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Wood's Point has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power, conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Wood's Point to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., IN OR FROM LANDS IN THE PARISH OF WURDIYOUANG PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown Lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorised, shall cut or remove live timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from the portion of Crown lands hereinafter named and described, viz.—Two thousand six hundred acres, more or less, county of Grant, parish of Wurd-youang: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment B of section 9; bounded thence by the west boundaries of sections 9, 8, and 7; being a line bearing south three miles, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment A of section 7; thence by a line bearing west one and a half miles; thence by a line bearing north to the south boundary of the Station Peak pre-emptive section; thence by the said boundary of that section bearing east to the south-east angle thereof; thence by the east boundary thereof bearing north to the north-east angle thereof; and thence by a line bearing east to the point of commencement; as shown on the plans deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(65.L.14968.)

KIORA TEMPORARY COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a Temporary Common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Kiora, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The allotments and pieces of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 1400 acres, viz.—Allotments 45a, 45b, 62a, 62b, a water reserve on the east of allotments 45a and 45b, a water reserve adjoining allotment 62a on the east, a water reserve adjoining allotment 62b on the south, and a water reserve on the southern margin of Lake Buninjon, between that lake and the main road from Wickliffe to Ararat.—(65.K.14924.)

PHAROS ROCK, PORT PHILLIP.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Pharos Rock, Port Phillip.

COMMANDERS of Vessels and Pilots navigating the entrance of Port Phillip are hereby informed that a Rock, with not more than twenty-five feet over it at low water spring tides, has been recently discovered lying about a cable's length S.E. by E. 4 E. from the Lonsdale Rock.

The following marks on Shortland's Bluff and Point Lonsdale were observed from a boat anchored on the rock:—West side of boatmen's look-out house just shut in with east side of Low Lighthouse, and the Tidal Flagstaff of its own thickness seaward of south end of roof of Telegraph Station. These marks on places you on the rock, which bears by compass from the High Lighthouse south thirty-seven degrees forty minutes west, and from the Tidal Flagstaff south fifty-six degrees thirty minutes east.

In consequence of this new danger and the Lightning Rocks limiting the deep water space in the fairway to about four (4) cables' lengths, all ships of heavy draught, whether bound in or out, when in the neighborhood of these rocks, must be kept as near as possible on the line of the two lighthouses; and all commanders and pilots are hereby cautioned against entering between the Heads and crossing the Rip at night, or during the strength of the ebb tide by day, with sailing ships of heavy draught.

It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract by giving a notice in writing of one calendar month to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.

(Passed at a Special Meeting held on the 15th January, 1866.)

ALL persons entitled to commonage on the Horsham Town Common, under the Land Act of 1863, and the Amending Act of 1865, will be allowed to depasture their stock thereon on payment of the following fees, subject to the undermentioned regulations.

2. The fees for horses and mules 6s., horned cattle 3s. 6d. each, sheep and goats 1s. 6d. each; progeny of sheep, horned cattle, or horses under six months old free; pigs not allowed on the common.

3. Travellers depasturing stock shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, but shall be liable to pay 6d. per head for horses and 2d. per head for sheep for every day beyond that time, but the managers shall have power to prevent travelling stock from remaining on the common for a longer period than twenty-four hours.

4. All fees to be paid in advance quarterly, the quarter to terminate on the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, 31st December in each and every year; the quarterly payment herein set forth shall not be divisible in respect to the payment of license fees.

5. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured, and each license granted will be under condition that he can be sued for the same, and the amount to be recoverable before any justice of the peace.

6. Holders of stock on the common shall muster them at a time and place appointed by the managers, of which due notice shall be given, for branding the same with the brand of the Horsham Town Common: all cattle, except working bullocks and horses, must be branded with the town common brand.

7. All stock upon which the fees have not been paid within ten days after the time when due will be impounded.

8. All cattle and horses found on the common, if not mustered and branded within twenty-four hours after notice has been given by the herdsman, will be impounded.

9. No butcher will be allowed to depasture more than 120 sheep at one time, and must depasture them on a part of the common allotted by the managers, and shepherd them at his own risk, and not to disturb any of the cattle belonging to the common that may come upon the said ground.

10. No entire horses be allowed to run on the common.

11. All bulls, or bull calves over six months old, found on the common without the consent of the managers, shall be impounded by the herdsman.

12. All trespass fees shall be paid into the general revenue of the common.

13. The number of stock depastured by any person on the common may be limited at any time by a resolution of the managers, they must at the same time allow such person fourteen days from the time of notice being given, either by advertisement or otherwise, to remove the stock.

14. All dead carcasses found on the common, the owners of which refuse or neglect to remove the same after receiving due notice from the managers or herdsman, the managers shall have power to authorise such removal at the risk of the owner.

15. When any animal is infected with any infectious disease the owners of such animal shall remove the same after receiving due notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put on the common without the permission of the managers, and if such animal has not been removed after notice given by the managers, the said animal shall be destroyed.

16. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any stock that may be depastured thereon.

17. The managers to meet at least once a month to transact any business that may come before them.
