# REQUIREMENTS FROM APPLICANTS FOR LEASES

IN AGRICULTURAL AREAS.

WHEREAS by the twelfth clause of The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things provided, that any application for a lease under the second part of the said Act may, within thirty clear days from the time the same has been entered as therein directed, be refused or disallowed by a notice, under the hand of the President of the Board, which shall be published in the Government Gazette within the period aforesaid, and shall specify the grounds of such refusal or disallowance. The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby order that every applicant for a lease under the provisions of the second part of the beforementioned Act shall, at the time of making application, salisfy the land officer or his substitute, and the local board appointed to assist such land officer or his substitute in determining as to the bona fides of applicants for leases in agricultural areas, as to his intentions and ability to comply with and fulfil the covenants and conditions imposed by The Amending Land Act 1865, in respect of all lessees of such lands, and such land officer or local board shall have power to require any applicant to make statutory declaration as to the truth of the statements he may make to such board.
