## REQUIREMENTS FROM APPLICANTS FOR LEASES IN AGRICULTURAL AREAS.

WHEREAS by the twelfth clause of *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things provided, that any application for a lease under the second part of the said Act may, within thirty clear days from the time the same has been entered as therein directed, be refused or disallowed by a notice, under the hand of the President of the Board, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette* within the period aforesaid, and shall specify the grounds of such refusal or disallowance: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby order that every applicant for a lease under the provisions of the second part of the before-mentioned Act shall, at the time of making application, satisfy the land officer or his substitute, and the local board appointed to assist such land officer or his substitute in determining as to the *bona fides* of applicants for leases in agricultural areas, as to his intentions and ability to comply with and fulfil the covenants and conditions imposed by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, in respect of all lessees of such lands, and such land officer or local board shall have power to require any applicant to make statutory declaration as to the truth of the statements he may make to such board.

## MOLIAGUL AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may

proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a temporary common for the use of lessees and selectors in the under-mentioned agricultural area in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:-

The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 8,350 acres, more or less, shall be a temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Moliagul, viz.:- Parish of Tarnagulla, allotments 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 46, 50, 51, 53, 78, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 97, 100, 101, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 120, 121, and parts of allotments 27, 54, and 77, all of section C; parish of Moliagul, allotments 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, all of section 5; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.9342.)

## COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:-

BAIRNSDALE TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Bairnsdale, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 30th day of September, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto

six hundred and ninety acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown land within the proclaimed township of Bairnsdale.—(66.N.13605.)

**COBDEN TOWN COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, comprising an area of one thousand three hundred acres, more or less, shall be a Town Common for the use of all householders of the township of Cobden, viz.: Commencing on the north boundary of the said township at the point where it is intersected by the north-western side of the road from Warrnambool to Camperdown; thence by the aforesaid boundary bearing west sixty-five chains, more or less, to a point bearing south one chain from the south-west angle of allotment 30, parish of Tandarrak; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and sixty-three chains, more or less, to the south boundary of the said parish; thence by the said boundary of that parish bearing east one hundred and four chains, more or less, to the west side of the road forming the west boundary of allotment 61; thence by that road bearing N. 0° 30' W. seventy-four chains, more or less, to a creek; thence by that creek, bearing north-westerly to a point thereon bearing south from the south-west angle of suburban allotment 5, township of Cobden; thence by a line and the west boundary of that allotment, bearing north two chains, more or less, to a point bearing east from the south side of the road forming the south boundary of section 3 in the said township; thence by a line and the last-named road bearing west thirty-six chains to the west side of the road forming the west boundary of section 1; thence by that road and a line bearing north thirty-three chains, more or less, to the aforesaid north-western side of the road from Warrnambool to Camperdown; and thence by the said side of that road bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.M.13688.)

**HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.**—The Horsham Town Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 10th day of November, 1863, and the 6th day of November, 1865, is hereby further extended by the addition thereto of the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of eight hundred and seventeen acres twelve perches, more or less, viz.: allotments 5 and 7 in the parish of Horsham, and allotment 12 in the parish of Doon.—(66.M.13325.)

**MOORABBIN AND MORDIALLOC FARMERS' COMMON.** described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th March, 1861, is hereby extended by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, subject to the condition that the managers of the said common do not allow sheep to depasture on land hereby added thereto, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing common, the said angle being a point on the eastern shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence by the south boundary of that common bearing east two miles, more or less, to the north-west angle of the Bangholme run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing south-easterly two miles thirty chains, more or less, to the south-west angle thereof, the said angle bearing west thirty chains, more or less, from the north end of the westernmost boundary of Wedge's pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing west to the Kanank Creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly to the north boundary of the township of Frankston; thence by the said boundary of that township, bearing westerly to the aforesaid eastern shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence by that shore bearing northerly to the point of commencement. Area 2,560 acres, more or less.—(66.M.10692.)

**MOUNT EGBERTON GOLD-FIELDS COMMON.** described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twelfth day of August, 1861, and the twenty-seventh day of January, 1863, is hereby abolished.—(66.M.13851.)

**RAVENSWOOD TOWN COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the township of Ravenswood shall be a Town Common for the use of all householders of that township; area 600 acres, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.13546.)

**W**HEREAS under and by virtue of the 12th and 13th sections of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, the Board of Land and Works have granted certain leases under their seal of certain allotments or subdivisions of allotments in certain agricultural areas, for the term of seven years, at the rent of Two shillings per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre of such allotments or subdivisions of allotments: And whereas it was provided in every such lease, and such lease was upon the condition, that in case the rent thereby reserved or any part thereof should not be paid in accordance with the covenant for payment thereinbefore contained, although no demand for payment should have been made; or if the lessee, his executors or administrators, should not before the end of the second year from the commencement of the term thereby created have made on the land thereby-demised substantial and permanent improvements within the meaning of the said Act, certified in writing under the seal of the said board, or under the hands of arbitrators, or under the hand of an arbitrator appointed as provided by the said Act, to be of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the land demised; or if the lessee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, should not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained, and on his or their part to be observed and performed; it should be lawful for the said board to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land thereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and from thenceforth the said term thereby granted should absolutely cease and determine; and it was thereby agreed and declared that in any such case it should be lawful for the said board, and for any bailiff of Crown lands, or for any other agents or officers of the said board authorized in that behalf, without any demand whatsoever, to enter upon the land thereby demised, and the lessee, his executors or administrators, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the said board had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land, and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law: And whereas the said board is desirous of appointing agents for the purpose of making an entry on any allotment or subdivision of an allotment so leased as aforesaid, in any case where a right to enter has arisen under any such lease: Now therefore the said board doth hereby appoint each of the persons whose names are set forth in the schedule to these presents to be an agent of the said board for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and doth authorize and empower every and each of them jointly and severally in the name of the said board to enter upon all lands so granted and demised by the said board to any person whomsoever under and by virtue of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and the lessee thereof, his executors, administrators, or assigns, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, in any case where a right to enter the same has arisen under any such lease as aforesaid.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tenders for —" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Government Stores, King street; or (if sent by post) must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.
