REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF ILLICIT DISTILLATION, ETC.

BYE-LAWS OF THE MOUNT ELIZA DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

THE General Board Meetings shall be held fortnightly, of which public notice shall be given at the office of the board, and may be attended by all inhabitants and ratepayers of the district, but no person otherwise than the members of the board shall take any part in the proceedings.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

1. Minutes of last meeting to be read and confirmed, and no discussion on them to be allowed except as to their accuracy.
2. Correspondence to be read and discussed.
3. Petitions to be presented.
4. Report of committees to be read for confirmation and adoption.

5. Secretary to report—First, banker's balance; 2nd, liabilities actually incurred; 3rd, balance in hand of collectors and treasurer; 4th, amount of rates collected since last board meeting.

6. Cheques to be drawn as may be deemed necessary.
7. Notices of motion for the next meeting to be put in.
8. The chairman may then bring under the notice of the board such business as he may consider necessary.

9. On the bringing up of any committee report or any motion, it shall be competent for any member to move its adjournment for consideration at the following meeting of the board, the same to have precedence of all other orders of the day.

10. No resolution involving an outlay of above ten pounds shall be considered (except on the report of a committee) unless notice of motion has been given at the previous meeting. Any member having given notice of motion may authorise another member of the board to bring forward the subject on his behalf in case of illness or unavoidable absence.

11. *Points of order.*—1st. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board. 2. The decisions of the chairman shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument. 3. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, and personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly. 4. Any member who shall use an expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the board. 5. That the chairman call to order any one out of order (whether he be a member or a ratepayer) and if the person deemed out of order refuse to sit down and be still, the chairman shall order him by name to leave the room; and if he still persists in his interruptions, the chairman shall order his removal, or give him in charge and prosecute him as the law directs.

12. Any member making a motion or amendment shall sign and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the board; nor shall any motion or amendment be entertained or discussed until seconded.

13. Any motion for adjournment, when seconded, shall be put at once to the meeting without discussion, and if negatived shall not be again made until the subject under discussion has been disposed of.

14. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation; nor shall any reply be allowed to the mover of any amendment, but the same shall be accorded to the mover of an original motion. After such reply the question shall be put to the vote in the following order, viz., the amendment first, and the original afterwards.

15. On any amendment being carried, it shall become the original motion, and upon such, a further amendment or amendments in like manner can be made until the question be settled.

16. Any member shall be at liberty to call the attention of the chairman to a point of order or the infringement of any part of these bye-laws; and any member so called to order shall sit down whilst the same is under discussion, but shall be able to speak to the point of order by way of explanation.

17. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or the motion under discussion.

18. All contracts shall be made by tenders, advertised for in such a manner and in such newspapers as may be directed, and by notices posted in conspicuous places in the district. Each tender shall be endorsed for the particular work it is for, directed to the chairman, and shall be left at the Road Board office. No tender shall be opened except in the presence of the board or committee authorised by the board, or will be accepted unless according to the prescribed printed form.

19. All monies received by way of assessment, together with the Government grant, shall be expended in each parish in proportion to the rates collected, after deducting the working expenses of the board.

20. Any one or more of the clauses of these bye-laws may be suspended *pro tem*, in cases of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the whole board.
